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T. PALACIOS TO CONGRESSMAN RAY SETIK CONCERNING THE CONGRESS!
POSITION ON MARIANAS SEPARATION TO WHICH HE HAD EARLIER REFERRED.

LATER IN THE AFTERNOON SESSION, REP. SETIK AFTER BRIEF
REMARKS, INSERTED INTO THE RECORD OF THE HOUSE A COPY OF HIS
REPLY TO THE PALACIOS LETTER.

SATPAN, JULY 2 (CONGRESS RELEASE) --- AS ONE OF HIS FIRST

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OFFICIAL ACTS DURING HIS CURRENT VISIT TO MICROESIA, THE NEW
DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF TERRITORIAL AFFAIRS MET TODAY WITH THE
SPEAKER OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA TO DISCUSS SEVERAL
TOPICS OF CONGRESSIONAL CONCERN.

THE AFTERNOON MEETING WHICH LASTED FOR OVER ONE HOUR, WAS "VERY CORDIAL" ACCORDING TO LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL KALEB UDUI, WHO NOTED THAT THEY WERE VERY IMPRESSED WITH MR. ZEDER'S SYMPATHETIC ATTITUDE AND POSITIVE APPROACH TO TH ISSUES RAISED.

THE TOPIC COVERED RANGED FROM THE PROPOSED SECRETARIAL ORDER FOR SEPARATE ADMINISTRATION OF THE MARIANA ISLANDS DISTRICT, TO REPERRAL RAYES AT U.S. MILITARY HOSPITALS FOR TT PATIENTS.

UDUI SAID THAT THE SPEAKER INDICATED THE NEED TO HAVE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA INVOLVEMENT IN THE ACTUAL DRAFTING OF A SECRETARIAL ORDER ON MARIANAS SEPARATION IN ORDER TO ENSURE A SMOOTH TRANSITION:

THEY ALSO REFERRED TO A LETTER FROM THE HIGH COMMISSIONER TO THE PRESIDING OFFICERS ASKING THEM TO DESIGNATE SOMEONE FROM THE CONGRESS FOR CONSULTATION ON THIS MATTER. THE SPEAKER ENDICATED THE NEED TO CLARIFY IF THE CONGRESS WOULD ONLY BE CONSULTED, OR IF IT WOULD ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN DELINEATING

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ASPECTS AFFECTING THE TRUST TERRITORY GOVERNMENT.

MR. ZEDER, IT WAS REPORTED, INDICATED HIS INTEREST IN HAVING
THE MATTER CLARIFIED AMICABLY AND A MUTUALLY ACCEPTABLE APPROACHDE REACHED. HE PROMISED TO TAKE THIS MATTER UP WITH THE HIGH
COMMISSIONER.



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WITH REGARD TO TT FINANCIAL DIFFICULTIES AND CASH FLOW PROBLEMS, MR. ZEDER WAS TOLD THAT SEGREGATION OF AND UPSTO-DAY ACCOUNTING FOR CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA FUNDS FROM TT FUNDS: WAS A NECESSARY STEP IN RESOLVING CERTAIN FISCAL PROBLEMS.

THE NEW DOTA ALSO SAID THAT HE WOULD GET IN TOUCH WITH THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE TREASURY WITH REGARD TO PROPOSED LEGISLATION SPONSORING TTPI MEMBERSHIP IN THE ASIA DEVELOPMENT BANK, AND WAS AMENABLE TO LOOKING INTO SEEING HOW EDLF MONEY FUNDS COULD BE TRANSFERRED TO THE MICRONESIA DEVELOPMENT BANK, ONCE THE BOARD OF THAT INSTITUTION HAS SUBMITTED A PLAN SHOWING HOW THE MONEY WOULD BE ADMINISTERED.

UDUI REPORTED THAT ZEDER WAS ALSO INTERESTED IN LOOKING FURTHER INTO PROBLEMS WITH USE OF HILL-BURTON FUNDS TO CONSTRUCT DISPENSARIES, AND THAT HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA AND THE HIGH COMMISSIONER JOINTLY MONITOR PROGRESS OF

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AN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR MICRONESIA WITH UNDP ASSISTANCE. THE MATTER OF HOSPITAL REFERRED RATES FOR IT CITIZENS WAS ALSO DISCUSSED, AND WHILE ADMITTING THAT IT WOULD NOT BE AN EASY UNDERTAKING, MR. ZEDER SAID THAT HE WAS SYMPATHETIC, TO ASKING THE DEFENSE DEPARTMENT TO RECONSIDER ITS DECISION. AT THE SAME TIME, HE FELT THAT THE TRUST TERRITORY SHOULD TRY TO BE MORE SELECTIVE IN ITS REFERRAL OF CASES AS A MEASURE TO HOLD DOWN ITS REFERRAL COSTS.

THE PRESENT REFERRAL RATE IS \$66.00 PER DAY AND EFFECTIVES JULY 1, 1975, THE NEW RATE WILL BE \$147.00.

ACCORDING TO THE SPEAKER, THE NEW DIRECTOR ALSO INDICATED THAT HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE HIS OFFICE AND INTERIOR MAINLY HANDLE BROAD POLICY QUESTIONS FOR MICRONESIA, AND LEAVE THE DAY-TO-DAY DECISIONS UP TO THE HIGH COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE, AND SAID THAT THIS WOULD BE A PRIORITY ITEM ON HIS RETURN TO WASHINGTON.
