SUBJECT: MARIANAS DELE GATION PRESS RELEASE

MARIANAS DELEGATION REQUESTS FOLLOWING PRESS RELEASE BE PASSED MNS FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:

THE MARIANAS DELEGATION, CONSISTING OF CHAIRMAN EDWARD DLG. FANGELINAN OF THE MARIANAS POLITICAL STATUS COMMISSION, SENATOR FEDRO A. TENORIO OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA, CONGRESSMAN DANIEL T. MUNA OF THE MARIANAS DISTRICT LEGIS-LATURE, MANUEL A. SABLAN AND JOSE R. CRUZ OF THE MARIANAS POLITICAL STATUS COMMISSION HAVE SPENT SEVERAL WEEKS IN WASHINGTON, D.C. TO REVIEW WITH THE DEFARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR'S OFFICIALS AND REFRESENTATIVES OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA REGARDING THE REPORT OF THE AD HOC COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATION CONTINGENCY PLANNING FOR THE MARIANAS SEPAR-ATION, AND ALSO MEETING WITH MEMBERS OF THE U.S. SENATE RE GARDING THE COVENANT TO ESTABLISH A COMMONYEALTH OF THE NORTHERN MARIANAS IN POLITICAL UNION WITH THE UNITED STATES. THE MARIANAS DELEGATION MET ON THREE OCCASIONS WITH THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA CONSISTING OF CONGRESSMAN RAYMOND SET IK, SENATOR JOHN MANGEFEL, CONGRESS-WOMAN CARMEN BIGLER AND LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL KALES LOUII. THE MEETINGS WERE HELD FOR THE PURPOSE OF SEEKING SOLUTIONS

TO PROBLEMS OF MUTUAL INTEREST REGARDING THE MARIANAS SEPARATION AND ITS IMPLICATIONS TO THE REST OF MICRONESIA. IN THE SPIRITS OF COOFERATION, RESPECT AND UNDERSTANDING THE TWO DELECATIONS ENTERED INFO AN AMICABLE AND PRODUC-TIVE DIALOGUE AND HAVE REACHED TENTATIVE A GREEMENTS FOR THE RESOLUTION OF ISSUES ON THE MARIANAS SEPARATION. THE TWO DELEGATIONS AGREED THAT MOST OF THE ISSUES FRESEN-TED BY THE MARIANAS SEPARATION ARE INTERNAL MATTERS WHICH COULD BE EASILY RESOLVED BETWEEN THE LEADERS OF THE MARI-ANAS AND THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA. THE DELEGATIONS FURTHER AGREED THAT CONTINUOUS EISCUSSION WILL BE HELD IN SAIPAN UNTIL THESE ISSUES ARE RESOLVED. THE MEMBERS OF THE TWO DELEGATIONS EXPRESSED THE IR CONFIDENCE FOR THE RESOLUTION OF THESE MUTUAL FROELEMS.

ASIDE FROM THE MEETING WITH THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA, THE MEMBERS OF THE MARIANAS DELE-GATION HAVE SPENT MUCH OF THEIR TIME IN THEIR CONTINUED EFFORTS TO MEET WITH AS NANY MEMBERS OF THE SENATE REGAR-DING THE COVENANT. AT THE PRESENT TIME, THEY HAVE MET PERSONALLY WITH ALMOST ALL OF THE MEMBER'S OF THE SENATE INTERIOR AND INSULAR AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AND HAVE ALSO CON-TACTED CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE SENATE FOREIGN RELATIONS AND ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEES. THE MARIANAS DELEGATION ARE ENCOURAGED BY THE WARM RECEPTION AND FAVORABLE MEETING WITH THE MEMBERS OF THE SENATE. DURING THE LAST WEEKEND THE DELEGATION MADE A SPECIAL TRIP TO HYANNIS PORT IN CAPE COD, MASSACHUSETTS TO DELIVER PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE LATE PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY TO THE KENNEDY FAMILY. THEY WERE HONORED BY A RARE VISIT TO THE RESIDENCE OF MRS. ROSE KENNEDY AND SENATOR TED KENNEDY. THE DELEGATION ARE CURRENTLY AWAITING THE MARK-UP SESSION FOR THE COVENANT WHICH WILL BE HELD ON OCTOBER 3RD BEFORE THE SENATE INTERIOR AND INSULAR AFFAIRS COMMITTEE. INGERSOLL Er
