(SENATE APPROVES FIVE MEASURES, HOUSE ACTS ON ANOTHER)
SAIPAN, FEB. 4 (MNS)---FIVE BILLS PASSED SECOND AND
FINAL READING IN THE SENATE OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA
AND WERE SENT TO THE HOUSE FOR FURTHER STUDY TUESDAY, THE
24TH DAY OF THE CURRENT 50 DAY SESSION OF THE CONGRESS.
THE HOUSE ALSO APPROVED ONE MEASURE AND SENT IT TO THE

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SENATE.

PASSED IN THE SENATE WITHOUT OPPOSITION WERE: A BILL
THAT WOULD REQUIRE THE HIGH COMMISSIONER TO SUBMIT THE NAMES
OF UNCONFIRMED INCUMBENTS IN POSITIONS SUBJECT TO ADVICE
AND CONSENT OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA WITHIN SIXTY DAYS
AND REQUIRE RECONFIRMATION OF ALL ADVICE AND CONSENT
APPOINTEES AT FOUR-YEAR INTERVALS, (SB 6-109); PROVIDE
FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF DISTRICT COURT JUDGES BY THE HIGH
COMMISSIONER WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE DISTRICT
LEGISLATURES RATHER THAN THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA,
(SB 6-244); REQUIRE THE HIGH COMMISSIONER TO SUBMIT COPIES
OF THE CONTENTS OF THE OFFICIAL PERSONNEL FILE OF EVERY NOMINEE
WHOSE NAME IS SUBMITTED TO THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA FOR
ADVICE AND CONSENT, (SB 6-243); PREVENT THE RENOMINATION OF
PERSONS WHOSE NOMINATIONS HAVE BEEN REJECTED BY THE CONGRESS
OF MICRONESIA, WITHIN TWO YEARS OF THE DATE OF SUCH
REJECTION, (SB 6-129); AND DEFINE WHAT CONSTITUTES REJECTION
OF A NOMINATION BY THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA UNDER CERTAIN
SECTIONS OF THE TT CODE, (SB 6-123). THE BILL WOULD ATTEMPT
TO CLARIFY THE PROVISIONS OF THE TT CODE BY PROVIDING THAT

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A REJECTION OF THE NOMINATION WOULD TAKE PLACE WHEN EITHER
(A) THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE APPOINTMENTS
REJECTS THE NOMINATION; OR (B) EITHER HOUSE OF THE
CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA DEFEATS A RESOLUTION GRANTING
ADVICE AND CONSENT.

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IN OTHER SENATE ACTIVITIES, YAP'S SENATOR JOHN MANGEFEL TOOK THE FLOOR OF THE SENATE AND SPOKE OUT AGAINST THE PROPOSED \$6 MILLION SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAMS FOR SCHOOLS IN MICRONESIA. (SEE FOLLOWING STORY FOR FURTHER COVERAGE OF MANGEFEL'S SPEECH).

IN THE HOUSE, A BILL TO INCREASE THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEES OF THE VARIOUS BUSINESSES IN MICRONESIA (HB 6-399) WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF 16-4 WEDNESDAY. IF THE BILL IS SIGNED INTO LAW, IT WOULD INCLUDE IMPORTERS, EXPORTERS, BANKS, SECURITIES DEALERS, INSURANCE COMPANIES, INSURANCE BROKERS, INSURANCE AGENTS, AND PUBLIC UTILITIES. THE BILL NOW WILL GO TO THE SENATE FOR FURTHER STUDY.

ACCORDING TO THE REPORT ISSUED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS CHAIRED BY PONAPE REP, RESID MOSES, THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEES WOULD INCREASE BY AS LITTLE AS 20 PERCENT

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IN THE CASE OF SECURITIES DEALERS AND INSURANCE COMPANIES AND BY AS MUCH AS 400 PERCENT IN THE CASE OF EXPORTERS.

PALAU REP, POLYCARP BASILIUS REMINDED THE MEMBERS THAT BY RAISING THE BUSINESS LICENSE FEES, BUSINESSES WOULD INCREASE THE PRICE OF COMMODITIES IN STORES.

REP. OSCAR C. RASA OF THE MARIANAS EMPHASIZED THAT THE RAISING OF ANNUAL LICENSE FEES WOULD NOT NECESSARILY JACK UP THE PRICES OF COMMODITIES IN STORES.

IN OTHER BUSINESS, THE HOUSE POSTPONED ACTION ON A MEASURE TO PROVIDE FOR A GRADUATED INCOME TAX ON WAGES AND SALARIES THROUGHOUT MICRONESIA (HB 6-85). THE BILL IS CARRY-OVER FROM LAST SESSION AND WAS UP FOR FIRST READING.

PALAU CONGRESSMAN ISIDORO RUDIMCH SAID THAT THERE ARE A NUMBER OF EVENTS WHICH HAVE HAPPENED SINCE LAST YEAR SUCH AS THE REPORT BEING PREPARED BY THE UNITED NATIONS ECONOMIC EXPERT ON THE COMPREHENSIVE AND BALANCED DEVELOPMENTAL PLANNING FOR MICRONESIA AND THE IMPACT OF THE POSSIBLE SEPARATION OF THE MARIANAS FROM MICRONESIA WHICH COULD AFFECT CONGRESS' VIEWS ON THE BILL. HE SUGGESTED THAT IT SHOULD BE STUDIED AGAIN BY THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE. RUDIMCH AND

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REP. HERMAN R. GUERRERO, BOTH MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE, SUBMITTED A MINORITY REPORT ON THE BILL.

FLOOR LEADER LUKE M. TMAN OF YAP MOVED TO POSTPONE ACTION ON THE MEASURE UNTIL FRIDAY (FEB. 6). HIS MOTION WAS APPROVED.

(ALL USERS: PLEASE CREDIT CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA)
(MANGEFEL AGAINST HANDOUTS)

SAIPAN, FEB. 4 (COM)---SENATOR JOHN MANGEFEL OF YAP SAID TODAY THAT PLANS TO BEGIN A U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE-SPONSORED SCHOOL FEEDING PROGRAM IN THE TRUST TERRITORY SCHOOLS WOULD BE "A BAD PROGRAM" FOR MICRONESIA.

"IT IS A 'HANDOUT' PROGRAM, I AM AGAINST IT UNLESS WE CAN DO IT OURSELVES," HE SAID.

MANGEFEL WAS REFERRING TO PLANS TO IMPLEMENT A \$6 MILLION SCHOOL FEEDING PROGRAM IN THE TRUST TERRITORY SCHOOLS, THE AGREEMENT FOR WHICH WAS SIGNED LAST WEEK BETWEEN OFFICIALS OF THE TRUST TERRITORY AND THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (USDA).

MANGEFEL SAID HE WAS SURE THE PEOPLE WHO ARE PROMOTING THE PROGRAM ARE DOING IT "WITH THE BEST OF INTENTION," HE

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TOLD THE SENATE IN A BRIEF ADDRESS. HE SAID MICRONESIA NEEDS SOME OF THESE PROGRAMS BUT HE BELIEVES SUCH PROGRAMS ARE NEEDED "ONLY WHEN WE CAN'T POSSIBLY DO THEM FOR OURSELVES."

"LET ME MAKE IT CLEAR THAT I AM NOT AGAINST FEEDING OUR SCHOOL CHILDREN," HE EMPHASIZED. "THAT WOULD BE LIKE BEING AGAINST BETELNUT. BUT I AM AGAINST IT UNLESS WE CAN DO IT OURSELVES."

MANGEFEL SAID THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA HAS BEEN TALKING ABOUT SOVEREIGNTY, THE RIGHT OF MICRONESIANS TO THEIR OWN DESTINY AND CLAIMS THAT MICRONESIA MUST HAVE ITS OWN IDENTITY IN THE WORLD.

HE SAID IF MICRONESIA IS SERIOUS ABOUT THESE RIGHTS, THEN "WE HAD BETTER TAKE OVER THE RESPONSIBILITIES THAT GO WITH THEM. WE MUST NO LONGER SUCKLE AT THE BREAST OF

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THE UNITED STATES. WE ARE NOT BABIES OR ADOLESCENTS."
"IF WE SIT HERE AND RECEIVE 'HANDOUTS' FROM THE UNITED
STATES, THEN WE CANNOT BE CONSIDERED REAL MEN AND WOMEN," HE
SAID.

MANGEFEL ADDED THAT IN SPECIAL AREAS WHICH REALLY

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COUNTERPART PROGRAM IS SET UP TO EVENTUALLY REPLACE IT. MANGEFEL SAID THE CHILDREN OF MICRONESIA SHOULD NOT BE FED BY SOMEONE ELSE. "IF WE WANT TO BE DEPENDENT ON THE UNITED STATES FOR EVERYTHING, INCLUDING FOOD, THEN WE SHOULD FORGET ABOUT THIS BUSINESS OF FUTURE STATUS, SELF-GOVERNMENT AND UNITY," HE SAID.

HE SAID IF MICRONESIA IS NOT "WEANED" FROM HANDOUTS, THEN INSTEAD OF THE FUTURE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA

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(FSM), MICRONESIA WILL HAVE "A FUTURE USDA." HE ADDED USDA WOULD NOT MEAN U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, BUT RATHER "THE UNITED STATES OF DEPENDENT ADOLESCENTS." (HICOM TO ATTEND PIDC CONFERENCE IN WESTERN SAMOA)

SAIPAN, FEB. 4 (MNS)---HIGH COMMISSIONER EDWARD E. JOHNSTON WILL LEAVE SAIPAN THURSDAY MORNING FOR WESTERN SAMOA TO ATTEND THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION (PIDC). JOHNSTON IS THE PRESIDENT OF THE COMMISSION, WHICH INCLUDES AS MEMBERS THE HEADS OF STATE OF GUAM, AMERICAN SAMOA, HONOLULU AND THE TRUST TERRITORY.

ON HIS WAY TO THE CONFERENCE, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER WILL STOP OVER IN PONAPE FOR A DAY TO VISIT THE PONAPE AGRICULTURE AND TRADE SCHOOL (PATS), PONAPE HOSPITAL PRESENTLY UNDER CONSTRUCTION, AND THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF MICRONESIA.

ACCORDING TO A SPOKESMAN FOR THE HICOM'S OFFICE, AIR ROUTES WILL BE DISCUSSED DURING THE THREE-DAY CONFERENCE IN WESTERN SAMOA. FROM SAMOA, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER WILL HEAD FOR HONOLULU FOR ANOTHER FIVE DAYS OF MEETING OF THE PIDC

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MEMBERS. JOHNSTON IS EXPECTED TO RELINQUISH HIS PRESIDENCY POSITION TO HAWAII GOVERNOR GEORGE ARRIYOSHI.

MARSHALLS SENATOR AMATA KABUA, CHAIRMAN OF THE SENATE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE, WILL ACCOMPANY THE HICOM ON HIS TRIP. HE IS EXPECTED TO RETURN TO THE TRUST TERRITORY

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FEBRUARY 17TH.

(FOUR MICRONESIANS TO STUDY LAW IN PNG)

SAIPAN, FEB. 4 (MNS)---FOUR MICRONESIANS WHO HAVE BEEN WORKING AT THE DISTRICT PUBLIC DEFENDER'S OFFICE IN PALAU, ROTA, TRUK AND KUSAIE, HAVE BEEN SELECTED BY THE TRUST TERRITORY GOVERNMENT TO ATTEND FOUR-YEAR LAW SCHOOL AT THE UNIVERSITY OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA, PORT MORESBY, PAPUA NEW GUINEA. THE FOUR SELECTEES ARE: ALEX CASTRO OF ROTA, BLAS SBAL OF PALAU, WANES SEMINA OF TRUK; AND HARRY SKILLING OF KUSAIE.

ACCORDING TO HERBERT D. SOLL, CHIEF PUBLIC DEFENDER FOR THE TRUST TERRITORY, THE FOUR STUDENTS ARE SCHEDULED TO DEPART FROM MAJURO BY AIR NAURU TO PAPUA NEW GUINEA ON FEBRUARY 10 AND WILL ARRIVE AT THEIR DESTINATION ON THE 16TH. SOLL WILL ACCOMPANY THE STUDENTS TO THE UNIVERSITY

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TO HELP THEM ADJUST TO THEIR NEW ENVIRONMENT. SOLL SAID THAT HE WILL SPEND ABOUT A WEEK AT THE UNIVERSITY, AND WILL MEET WITH THE SCHOOL OFFICERS TO DISCUSS AND MAKE THE NECESSARY ARRANGEMENT TOWARD A POSSIBLE "ON GOING PROGRAM". "THIS IS A SINCERE ATTEMPT ON OUR PART TO INITIATE, IMPLEMENT AND EXPEDITE THE SPIRIT OF MICRONIZATION," SOLL POINTED OUT.

THE FOUR-YEAR LAW SCHOOL WILL BE FINANCED THROUGH T.T. STUDENT ASSISTANT LOAN FUNDS AND SPONSORSHIP OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER'S OFFICE, SOLL SAID.

THE STUDENTS ARE NOT LATE FOR SCHOOL, SOLL INDICATED, BECAUSE THE UNIVERSITY SCHOOL YEAR, LIKE THE REST OF THE SCHOOLS IN THE SOUTH PACIFIC AREA, FOLLOWS THE CALENDAR YEAR.

(ESEA TITLES THREE AND FOUR SAC CONCLUDES SAIPAN MEETING)

SAIPAN, FEBRUARY 4 (MNS)---THE ESEA TITLES THREE AND FOUR STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL (SAC) CONCLUDED ITS WEEK-LONG MEETING ON SAIPAN LAST WEEK AFTER IT REVIEWED INITIAL AND CONTINUING PROJECT APPLICATIONS, VISITED PROJECT SITES ON SAIPAN, DISCUSSED PROBLEMS AND CONCERNS OF FUNDED

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PROJECTS AND MADE RECOMMENDATIONS ABOUT THE PROGRAM AND OTHER EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS IN THE TRUST TERRITORY, ACCORDING TO DAVID RAMARUII, DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION.

THE COUNCIL RECOMMENDED TO FUND THE MARSHALLS SCIENCE CURRICULUM PROJECT WHICH IS DESIGNED TO DEVELOP A RELEVANT INTERMEDIATE SCIENCE CURRICULUM FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS. ALSO, THE COUNCIL AGREED TO FUND THE METRIC EDUCATION PROJECT WHICH PROPOSES TO DEVELOP METRIC EDUCATION MATERIALS THAT CAN BE INCORPORATED INTO THE REGULAR MATHEMATICS CURRICULUM SO THE METRIC SYSTEM WILL GRADUALLY REPLACE THE U.S. CUSTOMARY UNITS IN THE MEASUREMENT COMPONENT.

THE ESEA TITLES THREE AND FOUR STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL IS COMPOSED OF: JOHN THARNGAN FROM YAP, TITLE THREE CHAIRMAN; TOSIWO NAKAMURA OF PALAU, TITLE FOUR CHAIRMAN; KINJA ANDRIKE, REV. (SKIPJACK VESSEL ASSIGNED TO TRUK)

SAIPAN, FEBRUARY 4 (MNS)---THE NEW FIBERGLASS PLASTIC SKIPJACK VESSEL, "MOKOROKOR" IS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE IN TRUK DISTRICT THURSDAY (FEB. 5).

MOKOROKOR IS ONE OF THE SEVEN VESSELS PROCURED UNDER THE U.S. - JAPAN WAR CLAIMS AGREEMENT FOR THE TRUST TERRITORY.

ACCORDING TO CHIEF, MARINE RESOURCES DIVISION CHRIS MITCHELL, NO FINAL COMMITMENT HAS YET BEEN MADE FOR THESE VESSELS. HE EXPLAINED HOWEVER, THAT THERE ARE REASONS FOR PLACING THESE VESSELS AT DIFFERENT DISTRICTS.

ONE IS TO PREVENT A TOTAL LOSS IN CASE OF TYPHOON OR DISASTER; SECOND IS BECAUSE OF STAFFING PROBLEMS; AND

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THE OTHER IS TO PLACE THE VESSELS WHERE THEY ARE LIKELY TO BE PERMANENTLY LOCATED, LIKE PALAU, TRUK AND THE MARSHALLS.

MOKOROKOR HAS ALREADY BEEN INVENTORIED AND ACCEPTED BY THE TRUST TERRITORY OFFICIALS ON SAIPAN. UPON HER

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DISTRICT, (HB 6-490); PROHIBIT ATTORNEYS EMPLOYED BY THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA FROM ENGAGING IN PRIVATE LAW PRACTICE, (HB 6-489); PROVIDE FOR THE FORMATION OF THE SOUTHWEST ISLANDS FISHERIES COOPERATIVE ASSOCIATION IN PALAU DISTRICT, TO EXTEND TO SUCH ASSOCIATION FUNDS AS GRANT-IN-AID AND TO SPECIFY EXPENDITURE OF SUCH FUNDS, (HB 6-486); REMOVE MEMBERS OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MICRONESIA DEVELOPMENT BANK, (HB 6-485); AUTHORIZE THE CONCEPTION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE RELOCATION OF THE CAPITAL OF MICRONESIA AND MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PRE-ENGINEERING, AND ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN AND PLANNING FOR THE NEW CAPITAL AND INITIATE GROUND SURVEY, SITE PREPARATION AND OTHER RELATED MATTERS, (HB 6-484); APPROPRIATE \$4,000 TO ALLOW THE PEOPLE OF ANGAUR MUNICIPALITY IN PALAU DISTRICT TO SEND A DELEGATE.

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OR DELEGATES TO PRESS AND ASSERT THE CLAIMS OF THE PEOPLE OF ANGAUR FOR PHOSPHATE MINING BY GERMANY, JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES, (HB 6-487); PROVIDE FOR LIVE BAIT RESEARCH, STUDIES AND DEVELOPMENT OF PROJECTS WITHIN THE TRUST TERRITORY, (HB 6-483); AND ESTABLISH THE COLLEGE OF MICRONESIA UNDER A BOARD OF TRUSTEES! (HB 6-482).
