(PALAUANS EXPLAIN REASON FOR SEPARATION)

SAIPAN, FEB. 20 (MNS) --- THE BELIEVE THAT A CRISIS FACES

PALAU DISTRICT".

WITH THESE WORDS, THE PALAU DELEGATION TO THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA AND THE PALAU COMMUNITY ON SAIPAN THIS WEEK EXPLAINED IN A SEVEN-PAGE LETTER TO THE LEGISLATURE WHY PALAU SHOULD BE SEPARATED FROM THE REST OF MICRONESIA.

(THE PALAU LEGISLATURE, IN TURN, HAS PLEDGED ITS FULL SUPPORT ON THE SEPARATION ISSUE AND THEIR OFFICIAL POSITION

IS EXPECTED TO BE MADE PUBLIC EARLY NEXT WEEK).

"THIS CRISIS INVULVES THE POLITICAL FUTURE OF MICRONESIA AS WELL AS THE POLITICAL FUTURE OF PALAU DISTRICT. MICRONESIA HAS COME TO A TIME WHEN DECISIONS MUST BE TAKEN AND DEVELOPMENT MUST OCCUR LEADING EITHER TO FRAGMENTATION, OR TO A NEW AND MOME LASTING ARRANGEMENT AND DURABLE RELATIONSHIP. THE DANGER SIGNS OF THIS CRISIS ARE MANY AND SERIOUS. AND ALTHOUGH THE ISSUES HAVE NOT YET MEACHED THE POINT OF EXTREME MATERIAL DEPRIVATION FOR THE PALAUANS ABROAD AND/OR IN PALAU, THE ACERBITY OF OUR RELATIONS WITH THE OTHER FIVE DISTRICTS OF THE TRUST TERRITORY HAS REACHED AN UNFORTUNATE AND INEVITABLE STAGE WHERE PALAU IS ON A COLLISION COURSE WITH THE REST OF MICHONESIA."

"IT IS OUR STRONG RECOMMENDATION THAT POSITIVE STEPS BE NOW TAKEN AND APPROPHIATE PROCEDURES BE NOW FORMULATED TO PUT INTO MUTION THE MACHINERY TO SEPARATE PALAU DISTRICT ECONOMICALLY AND POLITICALLY FROM THE REST OF MICRONESIA."

THE HISH TO RECOMMEND TO THE PALAU DISTRICT LEGISLATURE TO TAKE THE FOLLOWING SPECIFIC ACTIONS TO DISCHARGE ITS LEGISLATIVE OBLIGATIONS TO THE PEOPLE OF PALAU DISTRICT AND TO MINIMIZE THE STRESSES THAT WILL ACCOMPANY THE ANTICIPATED TERMINATION OF THE TRUSTEESHIP AGREEMENT GOVERNING THE ISLANDS OF MICRONESIA.

- ADOPT A RESOLUTION DURING THE UPCOMING SESSION OF THE PALAU DISTRICT LEGISLATURE EXPRESSING THE DESIRES OF THE PEOPLE OF PALAU DISTRICT TO ADOPT A STATUS SEPARATE FROM THE OTHER SIX DISTRICTS;
- ADUPT A FORMAL RESOLUTION REJECTING THE DRAFT CONSTITUTION FOR THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA;
- ENACT LEGISLATION CALLING FOR PALAU-WIDE REFERENDUM TO REJECT THE DRAFT CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATED STATES

OF MICRONESIA. SUCH REFERENDUM TO TAKE PLACE PRIOR TO THE DATE SET FOR A TERRITORY-WIDE REFERENDUM MHICH SHALL BE CALLED BY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER PURSUANT TO

- P.L. NO. 5-60, AS AMENDED; ACTIVATE THE WORK OF THE PALAU FUTURE POLITICAL STATUS COMMISSION AND HAVE THE COMMISSION REQUEST AND ACTIVELY PRESS FOR FUTURE STATUS NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT TOWARDS THE ACHIEVEMENT OF A POLITICAL AND CONST TIONAL STATUS SIMILAR IN NATURE TO THAT OF THE MAR! HAS DISTRICT COVENANT, AND TO SEEK THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE TIME FOR THE TERMINATION OF THE TRUSTEESHIP AGREEMENT AS IT APPLIES TO PALAU DISTRICT;
- ENACT LEGISLATION TO PROVIDE FOR THE REVIEW AND STUDY OF THE EXISTING DRAFT CONSTITUTIONS FOR PALAU DISTRICT WITH A VIEW TOWARDS FINALIZING ONE PARTICULAR TEXT TO BE PLACED BEFORE THE PALAU VOTERS IN A PLEBISCITES
- ENACT SUCH OTHER LEGISLATION AS SHALL BE DEFHED NECESSARY TO CARRY ON A CONTINUOUS REVIEW OF GOVERNMENTAL FUNCTIONS IN PALAU DISTRICT TO DETERMINE WHEN AND UNDER WHAT CIRCUMSTANCES ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS THAT ARE NOW RESERVED TO THE PRESENT HEADQUARTERS ADMINISTRATION CAN BE DELEGATED TO THE GOVERNMENT OF PALAU DISTRICT.

MOF THE THE OVERRIDING ISSUES -- POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT -- THE LATTER IS THE MOST COMPELLING. SINCE ANY GOVERNMENT OF THE FUTURE HUST BE BASED ON SOME REASONABLE SET OF REALISTIC EXPECTATIONS, CIRCUMSTANCES, AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN THE ECONOMIC AREA. THUS, OTHER THINGS BEING EQUAL. IF HE HERE TO ASSUME THAT ALL OF THE DISTRICTS HAVE NOW ACHIEVED RELATIVELY THE SAME ECONOMIC LEVEL. POSSESS COMPARATIVELY THE SAME ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. POTENTIALS, AND THE INCENTIVE TO PURSUE THEM, THEN PALAU SHOULD NOT SEEK SEPARATION FROM MICRONESIA. THERE WOULD BE NO POINT TO SUCH ACTION. UNFORTUNATELY, THE HARSH FACTS ARE THAT DISTRICT DIFFERENCES BUTH IN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND IN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POTENTIALS ARE SO WIDELY VARIED AND DIFFERENT THAT IF MICRONESIA WERE TO BECOME A POLITICAL UNIT AS A NATION IT HOULD BE ECONOMICALLY AND POLITICALLY

ATTEMPT AT NATIONALIZATION A HERCULIAN TASK. ADDITIONALLY. THE DISPARATE ISLANDS OF MICRONESIA, EACH WITH ITS OWN PECULIAR CULTURAL VALUES AND SOCIAL MORES. DISTINCT AND APART FROM THEIR NEIGHBORING ISLAND GROUPINGS. OFFER NU HISTGHICAL PRECEDENT FOR A VIABLE POLITICAL UNIT. THUS WE FIRMLY BELIEVE THAT IF PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES PREVAIL THERE CAN NEVER BE AND HILL NEVER BE A "TRANS-TERRITORIAL" SENSE OF ET-ALCITY OR CULTURAL IDENTITY AMONG THE PEOPLES OF THE MICRONESIAN ISLANDS. ALTHOUGH SERIOUS ATTEMPTS TO EUILE HICRONESIA AS A NATION ARE TO THE CREDIT OF THE UNITED STATES AS AN ADMINISTERING AUTHORITY, CULTURAL AND POLITICAL PLURALISH HAVE BEEN AND CONTINUE TO ACT AS A COUNTERFORCE INTENSIFYING THE SENSE OF SEPARATION. IT IS THEREFURE CORRECT TO SAY THAT MICRONESIA LACKS THE VERY CULTURAL COMPONENTS UPON WHICH THE DIFFERENT ISLANDS AND DISTRICTS COULD COEXIST WITHIN A SINGLE INSTITUTIONAL FRAME AS A NATION."

THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA WHICH HOLDS WITHIN ITS PARAMETERS OF LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY THE CATALYSTIC POWER TO FORGE A NEW NATION HAS DONE MUCH TO ENGENDER THE NASCENT SPIRIT OF NATIONALITY AND UNITY OF MICRONESIA. BUT EVEN THERE. DESPITE SUSTAINED EFFORTS TO RECONCILE REGIONAL DIFFERENCES AND TO SEEK ACCOMMODATIONS AND COMPROMISES. THE SUCCESS THUS FAR ACHIEVED IS MORE A MYTH THAN A REALITY. THERE ARE. OF COURSE, MANY PEOPLE WHO WOULD DISAGREE WITH THIS ASSESSMENT. BUT MOUNTING EVIDENCE OF DISRUPTIVE POLITICAL FORCES AND OTHER CASUAL FACTORS LEND LITTLE CREDENCE TO ARGUMENTS BEING MAJE BY ARDENT PROPONENTS OF UNITY THAT A PROSPECT OF A VIABLE

NATION CALLED "MICRONESIA" TRULY EXISTS."

"MUCH TO THEIR CREDIT. THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA.

INCLUDING THE MEMBERS OF THE PALAU DELEGATION TO THE CONGRESS;
HAVE ADVOCATED AND HAVE FAVORABLY APPEALED FOR A UNIFIED

MICRONESIA. DESPITE THESE EFFORTS, HOWEVER, IT HAS BECOME
QUITE CLEAR AFTER A DECADE THAT ANY CHANCE FOR RECONCILIATION

OF THE DIFFERENT POINTS OF VIEW OF THE DISTRICTS IS ANYTHING
BUT REALISTIC. IN SHORT, WHILE CONSENSUS AND COMPROMISE
HAVE ON OCCASIONS BEEN REACHED AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE
CONGRESS REGARDING SPECIFIC ISSUES, THESE SOLUTIONS SELDOM.

IF EVER, HAVE BEEN SATISFACTORY TO ALL. CONSEQUENTLY, THE
CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA HAS FOUND IT EXPEDIENT TO SPEAK

PUBLICALLY IN FAVOR OF UNITY AND AT THE SAME TIME TACITLY IF NOT ACTIVELY GIVE RECOGNITION TO THE DIFFERENCES AND UNIQUENESS OF THE DISTRICTS BY TAILORING ITS LAWS AND OTHER ACTIONS TO ACCOMMODATE EACH OF THE DISTRICTS. ONE HAS JULY TO JUDGE SUCH TRENDS BY EXAMINING THE EMPHASIS BEING PLACED BY THE CONGRESS ON DECENTRALIZATION ISSUE, ON REVENUE SHARING BETWEEN THE DISTRICTS AND THE CONGRESS, ON THE HARIANAD AND KUSAIE ISSUES, THE APPLICATION AND USE OF SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS, ADVICE AND CONSENT FOR DISTRICT LEVEL MOMINATIONS, AND THE FORMULATION OF DISTRICT PROOK BARREL" APPROPRIATIONS BY THE VARIOUS DELEGATIONS TO THE CONGRESS OF HICRONESIA."

"A CLOSE SCRUTINY OF THE DRAFT CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FROM THE STANDPOINT OF SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC IMPACTS ON PALAU DISTRICT MILL CLEARLY DISCLOSE MHY THE ADOPTION OF THE DRAFT CONSTITUTION IS INIMICAL TO THE WELL-BEING OF THE PEOPLE OF PALAU. FOR ONE THING, UNDER THE FEDERATION EVEN IF PALAU DISTRICT DOES NOT ADOPT THE CONSTITUTION. EACH STATE HAS NO RIGHT TO STOP PEOPLE OF DIMES STATES MITHIN DIFFERENT CULTURES FROM COMING TO LIVE IN PALAU. WHILE SUCH A CONCEPT IS LAUDATORY, THE APPLICATION OF THE APPROPRIATE PROVISION COULD LEAD TO THE CLASH OF CULTURES AND SOCIAL PROBLEMS. WE BELIEVE PALAU SHOULD HAVE THE SOWER TO CONTROL IMMIGRATION. AS REGARDS THE POWERS OF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE, THE PRESIDENT IS GIVEN ALMOST THE DICTATORIAL POWERS WITHOUT SUFFICIENT JUDICIAL CHECKS AND BALANCES WRITTEN INTO THE DOCUMENT TO MESTRAIN ANY EXCESSES IN THE EXERCISE OF THE PRESIDENTIAL AUTHORITY.

SUCH AS SECURITIES, BANKING, CORPORATIONS, AND YET THEY MUST ASSIST IN FINANCING EDUCATION AND HEALTH, SOCIAL SECURITY AND PUBLIC WELFARE."

"CURRENTLY" BOTH THE U.S. FEDERAL GRANT FUNDS AND THE REVENUES OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA HAVE NOT BEEN DISTRIBUTED OR ALLOCATED TO THE SIX DISTRICTS ON AN EQUAL BASIS. THE FIXED ANNUAL AMOUNT OF FEDERAL FUNDS GRANTED THE THUST TO ITORY HAS BEEN AND IS ALLOTED TO THE VARIOUS DISTRICTS O. HE BASIS OF OPERATIONAL AND CAPITAL PROJECT NEEDS OF THE DISTRICTS. SINCE MOST PRESSING NEEDS ARE FOUND EACH YEAR TO BE IN DISTRICTS OTHER THAN PALAU. THESE OTHER DISTRICTS HAVE HAD THE GOOD FORTUNE TO RECEIVE THE BULK OF UNITED STATES GRANT FUNDS. THE FUNDING NEEDS AND CAPITAL PROJECT REQUIREMENTS OF PALAU DISTRICT HAVE THERF BEEN COMPROMISED. OVERLOOKED. OR POSTPONED TO FUTURE FIS YEARS."

THE SAME HULDS EVEN MORE TRUE IN THE CASE OF THE CURRENT OF MICRONESIA FUNDS. DESPITE ECONOMIC POTENTIALS, DESPITE ITS HEVENUE CONTRIBUTIONS, AND DESPITE ITS ACCESSABILITY FOR OUTSITE MARKETS, PALAU DISTRICT HAS FOUND ITSELF IN THE POSITION OF HAVING TO BEG FOR FUNDS AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCES SINCE FUNDING REQUIREMENTS OF THE OTHER DISTRICTS ALWAYS SEEM TO BE MORE CRITICAL AND PRESSING."

"TIED TOGETHER WITH THE USE OF REVENUES FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IS THE STATE OF OUR MANPOWER SITUATION IN MICRONESIA. PERMAPS NO OTHER DISTRICT SO DISPRUPORTIONATELY CONTRIBUTES

THE TRUST TERRITORY IN SEARCH FOR BETTER EMPLOYMENT OPPURTUNITIES SINCE IT IS GENERALLY FELT THAT PALAUANS SHOULD NOT HOLD A MONOPOLY OF GOVERNMENT JOBS WITHIN MICRONESIA. THE NET EFFECT OF THIS IS A FUNDAMENTAL IRONY IN WHICH PALAU CONTRIBUTES THE GREATEST PERCENTAGE OF HIDDLE HANAGEMENT HANPOHER RESOURCES AND YET POLITICALLY PALAU IS UNABLE TO FIND THE WHEREWITHALS TO BUILD A SOLID ECONOMIC BASE AT HOME TO GIVE EMPLOYMENT

"FOREIGN INVESTMENT IS STILL ANOTHER ISSUE IN WHICH WE FIND GURSELVES AT ODDS WITH THE INTERESTS OF OTHER DISTRICTS.
