SAIPAN, FEBRUARY 22 (MNS) === TWO MORE BILLS ARE ON THEIR WAY TO THE HIGH COMMISSIONER AS A RESULT OF CONGRESSIONAL ACTION SUNDAY (FEB. 22). ACTION ON THE BILLS CAME WHEN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TO APPROVED THEM. THE BILLS WOULD: PREVENT THE RENOMINATION OF PERSONS

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WHOSE NOMINATIONS HAVE BEEN REJECTED BY THE CONGRESS OF
MICRONESIA IN EXCERCISE OF ITS ADVICE AND CONSENT POWER,
IF SUCH RENOMINATION IS SUBMITTED TO THE SAME CONGRESS,
(SB 6-129); AND CLARIFY THE FUTURE FUNDING OF THE OPERATING
EXPENSES OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY OFFICE, (SB 6-307).

CONCERNING SENATE BILL 129, THE ADMINISTRATION'S WITNESSES, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL AND THE DIRECTOR OF PERSONNEL OBJECTED TO PASSAGE OF THE BILL, SAYING IT WOULD "LIMIT THE PREROGATIVE" OF THE HIGH COMMISSIONER TO RESUBMIT NAMES AND THAT THE BILL IS "IMPROPER INTERFERENCE WITH THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF GOVERNMENT."

THE JUDICIARY AND GOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE HEADED BY POLYCARP EASILIUS OF PALAU SAID THEY DISAGREED WITH THE ADMINISTRATION'S POSITION. IF THE NOMINEE IS REJECTED BY THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE APPOINTMENTS, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER SHOULD NOT BE PERMITTED TO "STRONG ARM" THE CONGRESS INTO APPROVING THE NOMINEE.

"SUCH TACTICS ATTACK THE INTERGRITY OF THE CONGRESS AND THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE APPOINTMENTS," ACCORDING TO THE COMMITTEE.

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FURTHER, IF THE CONGRESS REJECTS A NOMINATION, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER SHOULD BE PREVENTED FROM RESUBMITTING THE SAME NOMINEE TO THE SAME COMVYNBBKJTHE COMMITTEE MAINTAINED.

THE HOUSE ALSO PASSED ON SECOND AND FINAL READING AND SENT TO THE SENATE FOUR BILLS WHICH WOULD: AMEND CERTAIN

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SECTIONS OF PUBLIC LAW 5-7 RELATING TO SURVIVOR BENEFITS, (HB 6-457); CREATE A DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND TAXATION, REMUVING THE REVENUE DIVISION FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE, (HB 6-400); AND PROVIDE PRIOR SERVICE CREDIT FOR ALL ELIGIBLE BENEFICIARIES HAVING BEEN EMPLOYEED BY THE TRUST TERRITORY GOVERNMENT FOR FIVE YEARS AND INCREASE THE BENEFITS FOR ALL ELIGIBLE BENEFILIARIES 10 \$10 PER MONTH, (HB 6-456).

THE LATTER BILL PROMPTED FLOOR DEBATE. MARIANAS REP. HERMAN R. GUERRERD OFFERED AN AMENDMENT TO INCLUDE THE PRIVATE SECTOR UNDER THE BILL. GUERRERD CALLED THE MEASURE IN ITS PRESENT FORM "UNFAIR" BECAUSE PRIVATE EMPLOYEES ARE ALSO PAYING TAXES.

A SHORT RECESS WAS THEN DECLARED. A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY OFFICE, ONE OF THE CONGRESS STAFF ATTORNEYS, AND FLOOR LEADER LUKE TMAN HUDDLED WITH GUERRERO AND DISCUSSED

TMAN THEN TOLD THE HOUSE THAT IN ORDER TO ACCOMMODATE THE PRIVATE SECTOR, THE CONGRESS SHOULD COME UP WITH NEW LEGISLATION.

AN ATTEMPT WAS THEN MADE TO POSTPONE ACTION ON THE BILL. THAT MOTION DID NOT PASS. THE BILL WAS THEN PASSED WITHOUT GUERRERO'S AMENOMENT WITH REPS. EDGAR EDWARDS OF PONAPE AND SASAUD HARUO OF TRUK VOTING AGAINST.

TWO JOINT RESOLUTIONS WERE ADOPTED. THEY ARE: ONE, REQUESTING THE URGENT REPATRIATION OF CERTAIN TAIWANESE FISHERMEN BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF CHINA; (HJR 6:172); AND THE OTHER, WELCOMING THE UNITED NATIONS VISITING MISSION TO MICRONESIA, (SJR 6-104). (BIRTHDAYS RESOLUTION ADOPTED)

SAIPAN, FEBRUARY 22 (MNS)---THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES ADOPTED A RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING FIVE OF ITS MEMBERS ON THEIR BIRTHDAYS WHICH FALL WITHIN THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA SUNDAY (HR 6-28).

THE RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY REP. RESIG MOSES OF PONAPE, PLACED ON THE RESOLUTION CALENDAR, AND ADOPTED AMIDST COMPLAINS

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PAGE 06 RUHGSAA3109 UNCLAS FROM SOME MEMBERS THAT THE RESOLUTION SHOULD BE REFERRED TO A PROPER COMMITTEE FOR A HEARING.

THE FIVE MEMBERS ARE: REPS. JOAB SIGRAH AND EDGAR EDWARDS OF PONAPE; POLYCARP BASILIUS OF PALAU; LAMBERT AAFIN OF TRUK; AND LUKE TMAN OF YAP.

REP. SIGRAH SUGGESTED THAT SINCE THE RESOLUTION DEALS WITH "SOCIAL MATTERS" IT SHOULD BE REFERRED TO THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION AND SUCIAL MATTERS WHICH HE CHAIRS FOR STUDY. HIS MOTION TO THAT EFFECT DID NOT PASS.

ACCORDING TO THE RESOLUTION, THE AFOREMENTIONED MEMBERS WERE BORN "NOT NECESSARILY BY DESIGN BUT BY ACCIDENT WITHIN THIS PERIOD" AND THAT IT IS "MOST APPROPRIATE" TO CONGRATULATE MEMBERS "SINCERELY, DIPLOMATICALLY OR OTHERWISE;" THE RESOLUTION STATED:

"WHEREAS, CONGRESSMAN JOAB SIGRAH OF PONAPE, KNOWN AS THE 'GEORGE WASHINGTON' OF KUSAIE, WAS BORN ON JANUARY 17; AND "WHEREAS, CONGRESSMAN LUKE M. TMAN OF YAP, KNOWN FOR HIS PARLIAMENTARY GYMNASTICS WAS BORN ON JANUARY 18; AND "WHEREAS, CUNGRESSMAN POLYCARP BASILIUS OF PALAU, KNOWN FOR THE HIRSUTE REGION BETWEEN HIS UPPER LABIAL AND OLFACTORY

THE RESOLUTION DIRECTS THE CHIEF CLERK TO CONGRATULATE THE MEMBERS WITH A HANDSHAKE AND BE FOLLOWED BY THE SPEAKER AND EXTEND THE SAME GESTURE TO THOSE MEMBERS WHOSE BIRTHDAYS FALL CUTSIDE THE REGULAR SESSION OF THIS CONGRESS. FURTHER, CONGRATULATIONS SHOULD BE EXTENDED TO EVERY PAST, PRESENT, AND FUTURE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES FOR HIS BIRTHDAY. "IRRESPECTIVE OF DATE."
