To Shift From Quantico to D.C.

WASHINGTON — The Marine Corps Museum, located at Quantico, Va., since 1960, will move to the Washington Navy Yard by next November.

Two new displays, however, will open at Quantico this spring and remain there. An aviation museum will be at the air station, in old Marine expeditionary hangars, to show planes ranging from a 1911 Curtis Pusher to post-World War II jets and helicopters.

An Ordnance and Technology Unit will be housed in the former post brig, displaying specialized weapons and artifacts like uniforms, equipment and flags.

The current museum will remain open through the bicentennial celebration but, shortly after Labor Day, will begin moving to a new Marine Corps Historical Center at the Navy Yard.

DoD Eyes Base in New Marianas Commonwealth

WASHINGTON — Both houses of Congress have approved measures granting commonwealth status to the Northern Marianas archipelago in the western Pacific.

The measures, strongly supported by Defense, have been sent to a conference committee.

Island residents voted overwhelming approval of a "covenant" with the United States on Feb. 20, 1975, which formally petitioned for commonwealth status.

DoD indicated to Congress it was considering building an air

base and renovating a port facility in the area.

Since 1947, the Marianas have been included in the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, an arrangement sanctioned by the United Nations.

The United States has functioned as the administering authority under the U.N. system.

Also in the Trust Territory are the Caroline and Marshall island chains, which are not being considered for commonwealth status.

Guam, at the southern end of the Marianas chain, already is a U.S. territory.
