

(BEADLES LEAVES TT)

SAIPAN, JUNE 8 (MNS)---FORMER TRUST TERRITORY DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION AND COMMUNICATION JOE BEADLES LEFT SAIPAN TUESDAY MORNING (JUNE 8) AFTER COMPLETING A FOUR YEAR TOUR WITH THE TT GOVERNMENT.

BEADLES, A RETIRED NAVY CAPTAIN, IS ON HIS WAY TO THE U.S. MAINLAND. HE SAID BEFORE HE LEFT HE PLANS TO RETIRE IN SUBURBAN PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA.

IN A SPECIAL CEREMONY MONDAY (JUNE 7) HELD AT THE OFFICE OF ACTING HIGH COMMISSIONER PETER T. COLEMAN, BEADLES WAS PRESENTED WITH AN "HONOR AWARD" FOR HIS "OUTSTANDING WORK IN MICRONESIA." STAFF MEMBERS ALSO PRESENT AT THE CEREMONY INCLUDED DIRECTOR OF PERSONNEL PODIS PEDRUS AND EXECUTIVE OFFICER JUAN A. SABLAN.

COLEMAN SAID HE WAS "VERY HAPPY" TO PRESENT BEADLES HIS HONOR AWARD AND WISHED HIM AND HIS FAMILY SUCCESS IN HIS FUTURE ENDEAVORS.

THE "HONOR AWARD" WHICH COLEMAN PRESENTED TO CAPTAIN BEADLES WAS "IN RECOGNITION OF OVER THREE YEARS OF COMMENDABLE SERVICE WITH THE U.S. GOVERNMENT AND IN PARTICULAR FOR HIS OUTSTANDING JOB PERFORMANCE AND DEDICATION TO THE TRUST TERRITORY OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS DURING HIS SERVICE AS DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION AND COMMUNICATIONS."

BEADLES FIRST CAME TO THE TRUST TERRITORY IN MID-1973. HE WAS APPOINTED TO THE POSITION BY HIGH COMMISSIONER EDWARD E. JOHNSTON TO SUCCEED PAUL WINDSOR WHO RETIRED FROM GOVERNMENT SERVICE.

A SUCCESSOR TO BEADLES HAS NOT YET BEEN APPOINTED. ELIAS OKAYURA, DEPUTY DIRECTOR WILL BE THE ACTING DIRECTOR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR HAS BEEN NAMED.

(PUBLIC DEFENDER AND AG OFFICE SPONSOR SEMINAR)

SAIPAN, JUNE 8 (MNS)---THE TRUST TERRITORY PUBLIC DEFENDER'S OFFICE AND THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE WILL SPONSOR A SEMINAR ON FORENSIC PATHOLOGY FOR MEDICAL OFFICERS AND LAW ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATORS IN THREE DISTRICTS BEGINNING IN PONAPE NEXT WEEK, JUNE 14-16.

DR. PATRICK BESANT-MATHEWS, CLINICAL ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF PATHOLOGY, AT THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON SCHOOL OF MEDICINE, WHO HAS A BROAD EXPERIENCE IN HIS FIELD WILL BE CONDUCTING THE SEMINAR. DR. MATHEWS HAS PREVIOUSLY VISITED MICRONESIA AND HAS LECTURED IN THE PHILIPPINES. HE WILL BE ASSISTED IN THE SEMINAR BY HERBERT D. SOLL, TT CHIEF OF PUBLIC DEFENDER.

THE SEMINAR ON PONAPE WILL INCLUDE SOME MEDICAL OFFICERS AND LAW ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATORS FROM TRUK DISTRICT.

JUNE 19-20, HE WILL CONDUCT HIS PROGRAM ON SAIPAN. IN PALAU HE WILL ALSO HOLD THREE-DAY SEMINAR JUNE 21-23.

DR. MATHEWS' LECTURE WILL BE ILLUSTRATED WITH SLIDES AND PHOTOGRAPHS. SOME OF THE SUBJECTS TO BE COVERED ARE AS FOLLOWS:

--THE MEDICAL EXAMINER AND THE COMMUNITY. THIS INTRODUCTORY LECTURE WILL BRING TO LIGHT REASONS FOR PROPER EXAMINATION OF DEATH AND WILL ILLUSTRATE THE IMPORTANT SERVICE THAT EXAMINATIONS GIVE TO THE SURVIVORS.

--PROPER HANDLING OF EVIDENCE SO THAT IT CAN BE ADMITTED IN COURT.

--INTERPRETATION OF WOUNDS. WHAT CAN BE LEARNED FROM THEM AND HOW THEY SHOULD BE DESCRIBED IN REPORTS.

--FIREARMS INJURIES. ENTRY AND EXIT WOUNDS WILL BE EXPLAINED, THE USE OF X-RAYS AND THE BASIC HANDLING OF INVESTIGATION.

--DEATH BY ASPHYXIATION INCLUDING DROWNING, STRANGULATION, AND SEXUAL PERVERSION.

--BURNS, FIRE AND ARSON. WHAT CAN BE LEARNED FROM A CHARRED BODY AND HOW CRIMINAL AGENCY CAN BE DETERMINED.

--DRUG ABUSE. WHEN INVOLVED IN DEATH, HOW TO DETERMINE CONCEALMENT OF DRUGS ABOUT THE BODY.

--SCENE OF DEATH. INCLUDES DETERMINATION OF TIME OF DEATH AND GENERAL POST-MORTEM. THE IDENTIFICATION OF UNKNOWN HUMAN REMAINS.

--THE AUTOPSY. HOW TO PROPERLY RECORD AN AUTOPSY AND WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TESTIMONY IN A CRIMINAL PROSECUTION MAY FOLLOW.

--RAPE INVESTIGATION AND FORENSIC DENTISTRY--HOW TO IDENTIFY DECAYED WILL BE INFORMAL AND ALLOW AS MUCH TIME AS DESIRED FOR QUESTIONS OR ACTUAL DEMONSTRATIONS.

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(BORJA COMPLETES MA)

SAIPAN, JUNE 8 (MNS) --- JOSE S. BORJA OF SAIPAN BECAME THE FIRST MICRONESIAN TO GRADUATE AT THE MASSACHUSETTS MARITIME ACADEMY AFTER COMPLETING HIS FOUR YEAR STUDIES MAY 29.

BORJA, 23, RECEIVED HIS BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN MARINE ENGINEERING; AND A MINOR IN MATH AND COMPUTER SCIENCE. HE ALSO BECAME THE FIRST MICRONESIAN TO PASS THE COAST GUARD ADMINISTERED EXAM WHICH MADE HIM "CERTIFIED THIRD ASSISTANT ENGINEER OF STEAM AND MOTOR VESSELS OF ANY HORSEPOWER."

BORJA PLACED NINTH OUT OF 74 ENGINEERS THAT GRADUATE. THE OTHER 45 WERE DECK CADETS MAKING A TOTAL OF 119 IN THE GRADUATING CLASS.

HE ALSO RECEIVED THE "ATHLETIC DIRECTORS AWARD" FOR HIS "OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION" IN THE ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT.

BORJA NOW PLANS TO WORK AS A MARINE ENGINEER AT THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND COMMUNICATIONS.

WHILE IN SCHOOL, THE SAIPANESE MARINE ENGINEER WORKED DURING THE SUMMER OF 1973 AS A CADET ENGINE-DECK ON THE MASSACHUSETTS TRAINING SHIP USTS BAY STATE; AND WAS A CADET ENGINEER ABOARD THE S/S MOBIL GAS.

BORJA WAS A CADET COMPANY COMMANDER DURING HIS LAST YEAR WHERE HE WAS IN CHARGE OF 200 CADETS. HE WAS ACTIVE IN SPORTS TAKING PART IN FOOTBALL, WRESTLING, AND BASEBALL.

THERE PRESENTLY ARE THREE MICRONESIANS ATTENDING THE SAME SCHOOL. THEY ARE CALISTRO MENDIOLA OF SAIPAN WHO WILL BE IN HIS SENIOR YEAR NEXT SCHOOL YEAR, HERMAN HENRY OF PONAPE AND LEO LIKOPWE OF TRUK, BOTH SOPHOMORES.

(OCCUPATIONAL ED. OPPORTUNITIES FOR MICRONESIAN STUDENTS TOLD)

SAIPAN, JUNE 8 (MNS) --- CLYDE SAKAMOTO, DEAN OF STUDENTS AT MAUI COMMUNITY COLLEGE, HAS ANNOUNCED THAT MAYOR ELMER CARVALHO, MAYOR OF MAUI COUNTY, HAS RECOMMENDED THAT THE MICRONESIAN COMPONENT OF THE MAUI COUNTY AND MAUI COMMUNITY COLLEGE SPONSORED MAUNA OLU PROJECT BE EXPANDED FOR THE 1976-77 SCHOOL YEAR.

ABOUT FORTY MICRONESIAN PARTICIPANTS ARE PLANNED FOR ENROLLMENT IN THE FALL OF 1976. THE TWENTY-FOUR STUDENTS WHO WERE PARTICIPANTS DURING THE SPRING SEMESTER OF THE 1976-77 SCHOOL YEAR WILL BE GIVEN PRIORITY. ADDITIONALLY, SIXTEEN NEW STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES WILL BE AVAILABLE.

TO QUALIFY FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE MAUNA OLU PROJECT, EACH MICRONESIAN STUDENT MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS: OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION OBJECTIVE; DEMONSTRATED ACADEMIC ABILITY; DEMONSTRATED FINANCIAL NEED; MINIMUM SCORE OF 30 ON THE DIRECTED READING TEST AND 50 ON THE TEST OF ENGLISH STRUCTURE; MINIMUM OF 18 YEARS OF AGE; HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE AND PREFERABLY AT LEAST ONE YEAR OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION; HEALTH CLEARANCE.

THE MAUNA OLU PROJECT WILL PROVIDE CLASSROOM TRAINING WORKSTUDY OPPORTUNITIES TO MICRONESIAN STUDENTS WHO DESIRE AND WOULD BENEFIT FROM AN OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION AT MAUI COMMUNITY COLLEGE. PRIMARY AREAS OF STUDY WILL BE IN VOCATIONAL TECHNICAL, AND BUSINESS PROGRAMS.

MAUI COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S OCCUPATIONAL CURRICULA PRESENTLY INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING PROGRAMS: ACCOUNTING, AGRICULTURAL CAREERS, APPAREL DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION, ARCHITECTURAL DRAFTING, AUTO BODY REPAIR AND PAINTING, AUTO MACHANICS, BUILDING MAINTENANCE, CARPENTRY TECHNOLOGY, DISTRIBUTIVE EDUCATION, GENERAL OFFICE TRAINING, HOTEL OPERATIONS, HUMAN SERVICES, POLICE SCIENCE, SECRETARIAL SCIENCE, WELDING TECHNOLOGY.

STUDENTS SELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS COOPERATIVELY SPONSORED PROGRAM BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF MAUI AND MAUI COMMUNITY COLLEGE WILL BE HOUSED IN DORMITORIES AT THE MAUNA OLU CAMPUS, A RURAL SETTING OF THIRTEEN ACRES NEAR MAKAWAO, MAUI.

CLASSES WILL BE CONDUCTED AT MAUNA OLU, AS WELL AS AT THE MAUI COMMUNITY COLLEGE CAMPUS. TRANSPORTATION WILL BE PROVIDED DAILY BETWEEN MAUNA OLU AND COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

ADEQUATE FINANCING WILL BE PROVIDED FOR EACH SEMESTER TO COVER EDUCATIONAL, HOUSING AND OTHER LIVING EXPENSES FOR EACH STUDENT. THE STUDENT WILL BE EXPECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE MAUNA OLU WORKSTUDY PROGRAM FOR TEN HOURS PER WEEK, TO CARRY A MINIMUM OF FIFTEEN CREDIT HOURS AND TO MAINTAIN A 2.0 GRADE POINT AVERAGE. IT IS ALSO EXPECTED THAT EACH STUDENT WILL BE AN ACTIVE CONTRIBUTING MEMBER OF THE MAUNA OLU AND MAUI COMMUNITY COLLEGE CAMPUS COMMUNITIES.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND TESTING DATES WILL BE ANNOUNCED SHORTLY. STUDENTS INTERESTED IN TAKING THE DIRECTED READING TEST AND THE TEST OF ENGLISH STRUCTURE SHOULD CONTACT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF MICRONESIA, THE MICRONESIAN OCCUPATIONAL CENTER, OR IN DISTRICTS OTHER THAN PONAPE AND PALAU, THE DISTRICT DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO SIGN UP FOR THE TESTS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

(MADRAISAU PROMOTED TO CHIEF MARICULTURIST)

PALAU, JUNE 8 (MNS)---BEKETAUT MADRAISAU, WHO HAS BEEN WITH THE MICRONESIAN MARICULTURE DEMONSTRATION CENTER (MMDC) IN KOROR SINCE ITS INCEPTION, HAS BEEN PROMOTED TO CHIEF MARICULTURIST, JAMES P. MCVEY, CHIEF OF MMDC ANNOUNCED.

ACCORDING TO MCVEY, MADRAISAU WAS PROMOTED BECAUSE OF HIS "OUTSTANDING WORK WITH THE RABBITFISH PROJECT AND HIS CONSTANT EFFORTS TO IMPROVE THE OPERATION OF MMDC."

MADRAISAU HAS RECEIVED ADVANCED TRAINING IN MARICULTURE UNDER DR. LIAO OF THE TUNKUNG MARINE LABORATORY IN TAIWAN AND ALSO PARTICIPATED IN THE JAPAN SPECIAL TRAINING PROGRAM FOR UNDERDEVELOPED NATIONS.

IN THE LATTER PROGRAM, MADRAISAU SPENT SIX MONTHS IN TWO MARINE LABORATORIES IN JAPAN WORKING ON SALTWATER SHRIMP AND MARINE FISH HATCHERY PRODUCTION.
