FALCAM'S REMOVAL WAS ANNOUNCED BY TRUST TERRITORY ACTING HIGH COMMISSIONER PETER T. COLEMAN EARLIEQPTHIS MONTH.

THE DEMONSTRATION WAS ALMOST VIOLENT, LED BY AWAK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEACHER MIGUEL PANUELO, THE DEMONSTRATORS ARRIVED PEACEFULLY JUST BEFORE NOON CARRYING PLACARDS, SIGNS, EMPTY CANS AND POSTERS URGING THAT FRED M. ZEDER, DXP EAWISKHOF THE O FFICE OF TE

RRITORIAL AFFAIRS AND COLEMAN TO "GO HOME." Zeder and coleman arrived on ponape Sunday (July 18).

"GO TO SAMOA COLEMAN," ONE SIGNED DEMANDED.HANOTHER ASKED: "WHY OUR DISTAD?" DECLARED ANMTHER: "ZEDER PLUS COLEMAN EQUALS DECEIT." "MICRONESIA FOR MICRONESIANS ONLY," REMINDED ANOTHER SIGN.

THE DEMONSTRATORS MARCHED THROUGH DOWNTOWN KOLONIA UNDN WENT STRAIGHT TO THE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING WHERE ZEDER AND COLEMAN WERE MEETING WITH PONAPE'S TRADITIONAL AND ELECTED LEADERS EXPLAINING THEIR REASON FOR FALCAMJS REMOVAL.

TVBZMOUT 105, HE SAID. "WE DON'T WANT HIM (COLEMAN) TO MISTREAT US," PANUELO SAID, ADDING THAT HE WANTS EITHER COLEMAN OR ZEDER TO COME OUT AND EXPLAIN TO HIS GROUP.

AFTER WAITING FOR NEARLY HALF AN HOUR FOR COLEMAN OR ZEDER TO APPEAR, ONE OF THE DEMONSTRATORS BLEW THE WHISTLE THREE TIMES AND SHOUTED "FIRE!"

AT THIS PMINT, THE WHOLE GROUP ARGED INTO THE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING ONLY TO BE HELD BACK BY POLICE BARRICADES. "THIS IS A PONAPEAN BUILDING AND WE WANT TO COME IN," SHOUTED ONE DEMONSTRATOR. JUST AS THE DEMON

MYZTION WAS ABOUT TO GET OUT

OF CONTROL, TT SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY MANNY SABLAN ORDERED HIS MEN TO SPRAY MACE AT THE GROWD. THE GROUP DISPERSED, MANY OF THEM RUNNING IN ALL DIRECTIONS SHOUTING OBSCENITIES AT POLICE.

COLEMAN SAID ON PONAPE MONDAY (JULY 19) LHAT HE FELT A CHANGE "WAS NECESSARY" TO THE POSITION OF THE PONAPE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR. COLEMAN MET WITH THE MICRONESIAN NEWS SERVICE MONDAY AFTERNOON FOLLOWING A DEMONSTRATION PROTESTING THE REMOVAL OF PONWPE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR LEO A. FALCAM (SEE PRECEEDING STORY) TO EXPLAIN THE CAUSE OF FALCAM'S REMOVAL.

THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR IS A CONTINUING OFFICE AND WHOEVER Hol

S A POSITION OF DISTAD DOES NOT HOLD A PERMANENT POSITION," EXPLJINED COLEMAN, HE POINTED OUT THAT A POSITION IS USUALLY IDENTIFIED WITH THE ADMINISTRATION THAT IS IN EXISTENCE AT TIME. " THE PRESENT ADMINISTRATION IS UNDER MY RESPONSIBILITY," HE DECLARED, FALCAM WAS APPOINTED TO HIS POSITION BY FORMER HIGH COMMISSIONER EDWARD E. JOHNSTON IN 1972. JOHNSTON RESIGNED HIS POSITION AND IS NOW THE EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT OF THE PACIFIC AREA TRAVEL ASSOCIATION (PATA) HEADQUARTERED IN SAN FRANCISCO.

COLEMAN SAID THAT HE REGRETTED THAT HE WAS AWAY WHEN THE ANNOUNCEMENT WAS MADE ABOUT FALCAM'S PENDING TERMINATPON. HE WAS ATTENDING THE UNITED NATIONY TRUSTEESHIP COUNCIL HEARINGS IN NEW YORK AT THE TIME. ZEDER MADE THE ANNOUNCEMENT AT THAT HEARING.

COLEMAN ADDED THAT JUST BEFORE HE LEFT SAIVAN ON JUNE 16 FOR NEW YORK, HE DISCUSSED THE MATTER WITH FALCAM AND INDICATED TO HIM THAT HE WOULD BE REPLACING HIM WITHIN 30 DAYS. FALCAM ASKED FOR AN EXTENSION OF HIS TENURE UNTIL DECEVBER BUT THAT

"I VAN APPRECIATE THE FEELING OF THE PEOPLE OF NOT BEING ABLE TO GET A CLARIFICATION," COLEMAN SAID REFERRING TO THE CONFUSION ON FALCAM'S TERMINATION.

HE MET WITH THE TRADITIONAL AND ELECTED LEADERS OF PONAPE MONDAY MORNING AND CLARIFIED HIS "CONCEPT OF CHANGE."

ASKED ABOUT THE TRADITIONAL LEADERS REACTION TO HIS ANNOUNCEMENT, COLEMAN AID THAT AT FIRST THE LEADERS ARE CONCERNED ABOUT NOT KNOWING THE CIRCUMSTANCES AND WHY THERE SHOULD BE A CHANGE. BUT AFTER EXPLAINING THE SITUATION LEADING TO HIS ACTION, MOST OF THE LEADERS ARE NOW SUPPORTING HIS DECISION.

COLEMAN ALSO SAID THAT AT THE PRESENT ALL "KEY

POSITONS" WITHIN THE TRUS TERRITORY GOVERNMENT ARE BEING ASSESSED AND THE EVALUATION OF PERFORMANCES OF THE INDIVIDUALS WILL DETERMINE WHETHER SOME CHANGES OR TRANSFERS SHOULD BE MADE.

ASKED WHETHER FALCAM COMMITTED ANY SERIOUS WRONGDOING WHICH WARRANTED HIS REMOVAL, COLEMAN REPLIED THAT HE FELT SOME OF FALCAM'S DECISIONS IN THE PAST WERE NOT "OF GOOD JUDGEMENT."

KOLONIA, PONAPE, JULY 19 (COM) --- THE SECOND SPECIAL SESSION OF THE SIXTH CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA CONVENED ON PONAPE MONDAY (JULY 19).

SENATE FLOOR LEADER AMBILOS TEHSI, PRESIDING ON BEHALF OF SENATE PRESIDENT TOSIWU NAKAYAMA, AND HOUSE SPEAKER BETHWEL HENRY WELCOMED THE VISITING CONGRESSMEN TO PONAPE DISTRICT.

IN AN ADDRESS TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, SPEAKER HENRY SAID "IT WILL BE A DIFFICULT SESSION" IN SO FAR AS SOME VERY COMPLEX ISSUES WITH LONG-RANGE EFFECTS MUST BE CONSIDERED.

PRIMARY CONSIDERATION, SAID SPEAKER HENRY, SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE INDICATIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR MICRUNESIA WHICH HE DESCRIBED AS "ONE OF THE SINGLE MOST IMPORTANT MATTERS TO CONSIDER" DURING THE SESSION.

"ONCE FINALIZED AND APPROVED, THIS PLAN WILL SERVE AS A BASIS FOR A DETAILED AND COMPREHENDBT PLAN, BASED ON EACH DISTRICT'S PRIORITIES AND RESOURCES." HENRY SAID THE GENERAL THRUST OF THE PLAN WILL BE TO "DECREASE DEPENDENCE ON DUTSIDE FINANCIAL AID, AND TO INCREASE REVENUES WITHIN

MICRONESIA IN ORDER TO SUPPORT OUR FUTURE GOVERNMENT."

SPEAKER HENRY SAID DURING THE REGULAR JANUARY SESSION OF THE CONGRESS, MANY IMPORTANT ISSUES WERE CONSIDERED SUCH AS FUTURE POLITICAL STATUS, UNITY, A NEW PERMANENT CAPITAL, LAW OF THE SEA, THE CONSTITUTION, IN ADDITION TO THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT PLAN.

ZL HENRY POINTED OUT, HOWEVER, THAT MANY KEY DECISIONS REGARDING THESE ISSUES HAD TO AWAIT ACTION UR DECISIONS BY THE TRUST TERRITORY ADMINISTRATION. THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR OR THE U.S. GOVERNMENT, BEFORE THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA COULD TAKE DECISIVE ACTION.

"THIS CONGRESS MUST DO EVERYTHING POSSIBLE AND APPROPRIATE IN URDER TO ACTIVELY SUPPORT AND POSTER THE CONCEPT OF UNITY, BOTH IN THEORY AND PRACTICE," HENRY STATED.

WITH THE ADMINSTRATIVE SEPARATION OF THE NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS NOW IN EFFECT, SPEAKER HENRY SAID THE LOCATION OF OHE NEW CAPITAL OF MICRONESIA IS ANOTHER ISSUE WHICH DESERVES "AFFIRMATIVE ACTION."

"THIS, OF COURSE, WILL BE ANOTHER DIFFICULT DECISION FOR VARIOUS REASONS, BUT IN ORDER TO SAVE COSTS AND TO PROVIDE AN ORDERLY TRANSITION IN THE FUTURE, THE CHOICE MUST BE MADE NOW, RATTHER THAN LATER," HENRY SAID.
