As you will see from the enclosed two copies of letters between Mr. Pedro A. Tenorio and myself, I am most interested in working with the Northern Mariana Islands Constitutional Convention if at all possible. I first developed my interest in Micronesia while serving as a Peace Corps volunteer lawyer there from 1972 to 1974.

I was not aware that your firm was doing all the legal work for the Constitutional Convention, and this fact may well eliminate any possibility of my participating. If, however, you might be interested in my services on a temporary basis - during the Convention - I would be eager to participate.

At present, I am a trial lawyer, doing primarily criminal prosecutions - both "white collar" and "blue collar" crimes. I am 33 years old and have a B.S. from Auburn (1964), a LL.B. from Alabama (1967) and a LL.M. from Georgetown (1970). I had occasion to work with Senator Edward DLG. Pangelinan of Saipan while I was serving in Micronesia, and I wrote Mr. Tenorio at the suggestion of Senator Olympio T. Borja, with whom I also worked while on Saipan.
