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(BOARD OF EDUCATION FOLICY OVERRULED) U SAIPAN, SEPT. 17 (MNS) TRUST TERRITORY ASSOCIATE JUSTICE ROBERT A. HEFNER HAS DECLARED A TRUST TERRIRORY BOARD OF DUCATION POLICY PROMIBITING EMPLOYEES OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT FROM HOLDING ELECTIVE OR APPOINTIVE

POSITIONS RULE AND VOID. THE JUDG EMENT, ESSUED THIS VEEK IN PALAN, PUT TO AN END A LONG AND CONTROVERSIAL DISAGREEMENT BETVEEN INCE EMPLOYEES OF THE PALAU DUCATION DEPARTMENT VHO ARE ALSO MEMBERS OF THE PALAU LIGISLAFURE AND THE TRUST TERRITORY

BOARD OF EDUCATION. THEY ARE SADANG SILMAL, PROGRAM COORDINATOR FOR THE PALAU EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND CURRENT SPEAKER OF THE PALAU LEGISLATURE; JOSHUA POSHIBA, CLASSROOMTEACHER AT PALAU HIGH SCHOOL AND VICE SPEAKER OF THE PALAU LEGISLATURE; AND TOSIVO NAKAMURA, SUPERVISOR OF PALAY ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS AND ALSO A MEMBER OF THE PALAU LEGISLATURE. JUSTICE HEFNER RULED THAT "IT IS APPARENT ON THE FACE

OF THE POLICY (TT BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY NO. 73-2) THAT IT IS SO BROAD THAT NOT ONLY TEACHERS AND THEIR SUPERVISORS ARE INCLUDED, BUT CLERKS, JANITORS, OR SCHOOL CAFETERIA PERSONNEL ARE ALSO WITHIN THE POLICY'S SCOPE".

WIT MAY BE ARGUED," HEFNER CONTINUED," THAT TEACHERS AND OTHER CRITICAL PERSONNEL SHOULD BE EXCLUDED FROM MEMBERSHIP IN DISTRICT LICISLATURE BECAUSE THEY CANNOT BE REPLACED DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR, BUT IT IS DIFFICULT TO IMAGINE THAT A CLERX, CODK IN A SCHOOL CAFETERIA OR A JANITOR CANNOT BE REPLACED FOR THE TIME NECESSARY TO ATTEND A

LEGISLATIVE SESSION." JUSTICE MERNER FURTHER POINTED OUT THAT EVEN IF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION DID NOT INTEND TO INCLUDE POSITIONS SUCH AS JANITORS AND COOKS, THE WHOLE ARGUMENT AND REASON FOR THE FOLICY COMES INTO QUESTION WHEN THE REMAINDER OF THE POLICY IS CONSIDERED. THE PURPORTED PURPOSE OF THE POLICY IS TO KEEP TEACHERS AND OTHER EDUCATIONAL PERSONNEL AT THE SCHOOL. HOWEVER, THE SAME POLICY DEFEATS THIS PURPOSE BY ALLOWING AN EMPLOYES WITH SUFFICIENT ACCRUED LEAVES TO ASSUME THE LEGISLATOR'S POSITION, IN ADDITION, THE POLICY PROVIDES AN "APPEAL" PROCEDURE IN UNUSUAL CIRCUMSTANCE, AND THERFORE, THE FINAL DECISION OF WHETHER AN EMPLOYEE MAY HOLD A POSITION IN THE DISTRICT LEGISLATURE IS VESTED IN AN EXCUTIVE BRANCH OFFICIAL OR THE BOARD OF EDUCATION. HEFNER SAID "THE POSSIBILITY OF MANIPULATION OF THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH IS EVER PRESENT UNDER THE EXISTING POLICY".

JUSTICE HEFNER STATED THAT THE TT BOARD OF EDUCATION CAN STILL SET PROPER LIMITATIONS UPON EDUCATION EMPLOYEES TO ASSURE THEIR PRESENCE ON A DAY TO DAY BASIS DURING THE CRUCIAL DAYS AND MONTHS OF THE SCHOOL YEAR.

"THE INTENTION OF THE CONGRESS OF MICORNESIA IN ENACTING TITLE 61 OF THE TT CODE IS CLEAR. IF ANY GOVERNMENT EMPLOYES WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE ACT ENGAGES IN ANY OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT OR OTHER OUTSIDE ACTIVITY NOT COMPATIBLE WITH THE FULL TIME AND PROPER DISCHARGE OF THE RESPONSIBLITIES OF HIS POSITION, THE EMPLOYEE MUST CHOOSE BETWEEN HIS JOB OR OUTSIDE ACTIVITY", JUSTICE HEFNER SAID. HE CONCLUDED HIS JUDGEMENT BY SAYING "ALTHOUGH THE

PLAINTIFFS WIN THE BATTLE OVER POLICY NO. 73-2, THEY MAY WELL LOSE THE WAR OVER THE APPLICATION OF TITLE 62 AND ANY TT BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY FORMULATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAW".

(DITOR OF FACIFIC DAILY NEWS COMMENT ON PALAU REFERENDUM) SAIPAN, SEPT. 17 (MNS) ---THE SEPTEMBER 17 ISSUE OF THE PACIFIC DAILY NEWS CARRIED AN EDITORIAL ON THE PALAU REFERENDUM WRITTEN BY J. C. MURPHY (PDN EDITOR) WHICH CONTAINED SOME ASTUTE OBSERVATIONS AND COMMENTS ON THE PALAU POLITICAL SITUATION. THE MICRONESIAN NEWS SERVICE HAS COTAINED PERMISSION FROM MR. "THE UNITED STATES HAS BACKED ITSELF INTO A CORNER -- IN A THINLY DISGUISED BID TO GRAB SOME NEEDED LAND FOR MILITARY BASSES IN THE NORTHERN MARIANAS -- BY AGREEING TO HOLD SEPARATE POLITICAL STATUS NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE PEOPLE OF THE NORTHERN MARIANAS." "WE'RE NOT SURE HOW THE U.S. NOW CAN DENY SUCH NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE PEUPLE OF PALAU AND THE MARSHALLS."

"ALL THE DOUBLE-TALK IN THE WORLD WOULD FAIL TO CONVINCE US THAT ONE GROUP OF PEOPLE, THOSE OF THE MARIANAS, ARE SOMEHOW DIFFERNT THAN THE OTHER ISLANDERS, IN PALAU AND IN THE MARSHALLS, IN THE BASIC RIGHT FOR SELF-DETERMINATION."

WE HAVE EMPATHY FOR A GROUP OF PALAUANS WHO HAVE BEEN VISITING GUAM THE LAST SEVERAL DAYS TRYING TO DRUM UP INTERST IN THE ELECTION. THEY ALSO TRIED TO GET THE FEELINGS OF THE MANY PALAUANS LIVING ON GUAM ABOUT THE FUTURE POLITICAL STATUS."

A FOUR-MEMBER DELEGATION LED BY KUNIWO NAKAMURA, A MEMBER OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA, MET WITH PALAUAN UNIVERSITY STUDENTS WEDWESDAY IN ENING AND WITH ISLAND PALAUAN LEADERS ON THURSDAY. THEY EXPLAINED THAT THE POLITICAL-STATUS REFERENDUM, TO BE HELD NEXT FRIDAY IN PALAU, IS CRUCIAL. NAKAMURA HOPES THAT THE REFERENDUM WILL CONFIRM THE POSITION OF THE PALAU DISTRICT LEGISLATURE IN CALLING FOR SEPARATE TALKS ON POLITICAL STATUS BETWEEN THE PALAUANS AND THE UNITED STATES."

"THE PALAUANS WANTED TO ENSURE THAT THE ELECTION WAS COMPLETELY OPEN AND ABOVE BOARD, SO THEY REQUESTED THAT THE U.S. GOVERNMENT, SEND OBSERVERS TO CHICK ON THE PROCEEDINGS. THE U.S. GOVERNMENT REFUSED TO DO THIS BECAUSE THAT WOULD IMPLY THAT IT WOULD BE BOUND BY THE DECISION OF THE VOTERS ON SEPARATE STATUS (IF THAT IS WHAT THEY DECIDE)."

"NEXT THE PALAUANS TRIED TO GET THE UNITED NATIONS TO MONITOR THE ELECTION, BUT THAT TOO WAS TURNED DOWN, PRESUMABLY AT THE REQUEST OF THE U.S. DELEGATION, WHICH PREFERS TO THINK OF THIS AS AN INTERNAL MATTER AND THUS OF NO CONCERN TO THE UNITED NATIONS."

IN AN UNPRECEDENTED MOVE FOR POLITICAL PARTIES, BOTH PARTIES HAVE DECIDED TO SUPPORT THE SAME CAMDIDATES IN A SID TO KEEP DOWN CONTROVERSY AND TO BETTER UNIFY THE DISTRICT."

UNIFY THE DISTRICT.". "THE PALAUAN LEADERS ARE AFRAID THAT A BITTER CAMPAIGN WOULD CREATE DISSENTION, WHICH MAY AFFECT ADVERSELY THE POLITICAL OBJECTIVES OF PALAU."

"THE MOVE FOR SEPARATION IS NOT A NEW THING," NAKAMURA POINTED OUT. HE SAID THAT A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR SEPARATE POLITICAL-STATUS NEGOTIATIONS FOR PALAU FIRST WAS INTRODUCED IN 1947 IN THE FORMER CONGRESS OF PALAU."

"THE IDEA WAS PUT ON THE BACK BURNER FOR MANY YEARS AS THE PALAUANS, ALONG WITH THE REST OF THE MICRONESIANS, HOPED THAT SOME KIND OF ISLANDWIDE UNITY COULD BE WORKED OUT. "IN THE PASS FEW YEARS," NAKAMURA SAID, "WE'VE REALIZED THAT UNITY IS NOT A REALITY. IS IS A MYTH."

"THE UNITY IDEA WAS FOSTERED, PERHAPS PARTIALLY BY THE U.S. AND THE U.N. WHO REALLY WOULD LIKE TO SEE AN OVERALL SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEM OF MICRONESIA WITH ITS MANY TINY ISLAND CLUSTERS. IT WOULD BE MUCH EASIER FOR THE U.S. TO DEAL WITH ALL THE ISLANDS COLLECTIVELY INSTEAD OF SEPARATELY

DEAL WITH ALL THE ISLANDS COLLECTIVELY INSTEAD OF SEPARATELY." "THE VIEW OF UNITY WAS ENDORSED FOR MANY YEARS BY MEMBER OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA WHO SEEMED TO GET ALONG WELL TOGETHER. THE IDEA WAS PICKED UP BY MANY OF THE MICRONESIAN UNIVESITY STUDENTS WHO STUCK TOGETHER DURING THEIR SCHOOL DAYS."

"BUT MICRONESIAN UNITY ALWAYS HAS BEEN A QUESTIONABLE CONCEPT, DESPITE THE OBVIOUS POLITICAL SENSE IT MAKES. THE ISLANDERS REPRESENT WIDELY SCATTERED ISLAND CHAINS, WITH LITTLE IN COMMON ECONOMICALLY OR SOCIALLY. THERE NEVER HAS BEEN MUCH INTERISLAND COMMERCE OR INTERMARRIAGE, FOR INSTANCE. THE LANGUAGES AND THE CULTURES ARE DIFFERENT."

SOME DAY IT WOULD MAKE SENSE TO HAVE A LOOSE FEDERATION OF ISLANDS OUT IN THE PACIFIC BECAUSE THEY DO HAVE SOME THINGS IN COMMON, INCLUDING HISTORIC TIES WITH THE U.S. AND THEY DO HAVE THE SEA.

"BUT RIGHT NOW, AS WE SEE IT, EACH ISLAND GROUP IS GOING TO HAVE TO DO ITS OWN THING, AS DISTASTEFUL AS THAT MAY BE TO THE U.S. OR THE UNITED NATIONS."

"ARE THEY ENTITLED TO CHOOSE THEIR OWN POLITICAL FUTURE? OR SHOULD THE PEOPLE OF YAP, PONAPE AND THE MARSHALLS HELP THE PALAUANS CHOOSE? THAT IS THE QUESTION."

(UNTC CONCLUSIONS)

SAIPAN--SEPTEMBER 15, 1976--(COM RELEASE) --- THE UNITED NATIONS TRUSTEESHIP COUNCIL HAS REAFFIRMED ITS POSITION THAT "THE UNITY OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS AND THE CAROLINE ISLANDS SHOULD BE PRESERVED" ACCORDING TO A COPY OF ITS DRAFT CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS MADE AVAILABLE TO THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA.

THE TRUSTEESHIP COUNCIL DOCUMENT WAS ISSUED ON JULY 8, 1976 FOLLOWING THE 43RD SESSION, AND WILL, IN ITS FINAL FORM, BE PART OF THE COUNCIL'S REPORT TO THE SECURITY COUNCIL.

THE COUNCIL ALSO MADE OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS CONCERNING THE POLITICAL, SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC PROGRESS IN MICRONESIA.

IT NOTED WITH "SATISFACTION" THE U.S. REAFFIRMATION THAT THE TRUSTEESHIP WOULD BE TERMINATED AT THE SAME TIME FOR ALL PARTS

OF MICRONESIA "AND NOT FOR ONE PART SEPARATELY." REGARDING THE VETO FOWER OF THE HIGH COMMISSIONER, THE COUNCIL NOTED WITH "CONCERN" THAT THE U.S. "HAD NOT IMPLEMENTED ITS PREVIOUS RECOMMENDATION" THAT A DISTINCTION SHOULD BE MADE BETYEEN THE SPECIAL INTERESTS OF THE TRUST TERRITORY AND THE U.S. INTERNATIONAL OBLIGATIONS WITH THE "ULTIMATE OBJECTIVE OF RESTRICTING AS FAR AS POSSIBLE THE

OCCASIONS FOR THE EXERCISE OF THE POWER OF THE VETO..." CONCERNING THE AUTHORITY OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA OVER THE TRUST TERRITORY BUDGET, THE COUNCIL SAID IT "WELCOMES" THE NEU BUDGETARY PROCEDURE BY THE CONGRESS TO PRESENT ITS OWN VISION OF THE BUDGET TO THE U.S. COWGRISS AND SAID THAT THIS STEP "SHOULD BE ACCOMPANTED BY CLOSER INVOLVEMENT OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA IN THE ALLOCATION OF FUNDS.

MICRONESIAN WAR CLAIMS WAS ALSO MENTIONED AND THE COUNCIL SAID THAT WHILE THEY CONSIDERED THAT TITLE I CLAIMS WERE SETTLED, THEY URGED THAT "TOTAL FUNDS AVAILABLE SHOULD BE INCREASED TOWARDS THE LEVE ENVISAGE BY THE MICRONESIAN CLAIMS COMMISSION, SO THAT AJUDICATED CLAIMS MAY BE PAID IN FULL" FOR TITLE II.

WITH RESPECT TO MICRONESIANS ASSUMING POSITIONS OF HIGH RESPONSIBLITY IN GOVERNMENT, THE COUNCIL SAID THAT THE U.S. SHOULD "GIVE SERIOUS CONSIDERATION TO PREPARING MIORONSIANS FOR ASSUMING THE HIGHEST EXCUTIVE FUNCTIONS" AND THAT IT SAW "VALUE IN PROMOTING A MICRONESIAN TO THE

SECOND MOST SENIOR POST IN THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH." IT ALSO REAFFIRMED THE "NEED FOR THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA TO BE CONSULTED BEFORE THE APPOINTMENT OR REMOVAL OF JUDGES OF THE HIGH COURT."

ON LAW OF THE SEA, THE COUNCIL NOTED THE STRONG VIEWS EXPRESSED BY SENATE PRESIDENT TOSIWO NAKAYANA THAT IT WAS VITAL MICRONESIA'S INTERESTS IN THE POTENTIAL WEALTH OF THE OCEAN BE PRESERVED FOR HER PEOPLE AND THAT THEY SHOULD BE FULLY TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT.

THE COUNCIL, HOWEVER, FAILED TO ACTUALLY ENDORSING THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA'S POSITION AND ONLY NOTED THAT "THE INTERESTS OF MICRONESIA MAY NOT NECESSARILY COINCIDE WITH THE INTEREST" OF THE U.S. REGARDING THE COMPACT AND THE CONSTITUTION, THE COUNCIL SAID THAT "THE STATUS OF FREE ASSOCIATION AT

PRESENT UNDER CONSIDERATION, IF ENDORSED BY THE POPULATION, WOULD NOT BE INCONSISTENT WITH THE AIMS OF THE

TRUSTEESHIP AGREEMENT" AND THAT THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA STRUMULD "DO ITS BEST" TO ENSURE THAT WHEN THE CONSTITUTION IS VOTED UPON BY THE PEOPLE OF MICRONESIA, "IT WILL BE IN A FORM LIKELY TO BE ACCEPTABLE TO ALL THE DISTRICTS IN THE CAROLINE AND MARSHALL ISLANDS." CONCERNING THE PEOPLE OF KIKINI AND THEIR RETURN, THE CONNELL RECOMMENDED THAT THE MECHESCARY FUNDS BE DROUTDED

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CONCERNING THE PEOPLE OF KIKINI AND THEIR RETURN, THE COUNCIL RECOMMENDED THAT THE NECESSARY FUNDS BE PROVIDED FOR A RADIOLOGICAL SURVEY "SO THAT A DECISION MAY BE MADE BY THE PEOPLE OF BIKINI EITHER TO RETURN TO THEIR ANCESTRAL HOME OR TO OBTAIN IMPROVEMENTS IN THEIR LIVING CONDITIONS ON KILL."
