1. FOLLOWING GUIDANCE ON ABOVE SUBJECT PREPARED FOR POSSIBLE USE AT PRESS BRIEFING TODAY DEC. 13. COMMENTS HOWEVER WERE NOT USED AND THEREFORE HAVE NOT RPT NOT BEEN MADE PUBLIC. BRIEFING NEVERTHELESS PROVIDES BASIC GUIDANCE WHICH YOU MAY DRAW ON AS APPROPRIATE.

Q: WOULD YOU COMMENT ON BOB WOODWARD'S ARTICLE IN THE WASHINGTON POST ON SUNDAY ABOUT CIA INTELLIGENCE ACTIVITY IN MICRONESIA?

A. IN ACCORDANCE WITH LONG-STANDING PRACTICE, I CANNOT COMMENT ON ALLEGATIONS ABOUT ANY ALLEGED CIA ACTIVITIES.

Q: IS IT TRUE THAT THE QUESTION OF THE LEGALITY OF CIA SURVEILLANCE IN MICRONESIA IS CURRENTLY UNDER STUDY?

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A: AS I SAID, WE DO NOT COMMENT ON PRESS STORIES ABOUT INTELLIGENCE MATTERS.

Q: WHY DID THE U.S. SIDE RECENTLY REQUEST A DELAY IN TALKS WITH THE MICRONESIANS?

A: THE REASON FOR THE U.S. SUGGESTION THAT INFORMAL TALKS BE HELD NEXT MONTH WAS THE DESIRE TO ATTAIN AN INTER-AGENCY AGREEMENT ON THE COMPLEX MARINE RESOURCES--LAW OF THE SEA ISSUES.

Q: IS THE U.S. TRYING TO DENY INDEPENDENCE TO THE MICRO- NESIANS?

A: NO. THE U.S. IS COMMITTED TO FULFILLING ITS RESPONS-
IBILITY UNDER THE TRUSTEESHIP AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE SELF-
GOVERNMENT IN THE TRUST TERRITORY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
FREELY EXPRESSED WISHES OF THE PEOPLES CONCERNED. UP TO
NOW, THE MICRONESIANS HAVE FAVORED A FREE ASSOCIATION RELA-
TIONSHIP. UNDER THIS RELATIONSHIP, SOVEREIGNTY WOULD
RESIDE IN THE PEOPLE OF MICRONESIA WHO WOULD VEST IN THE
U.S. FOR 15 YEARS RESPONSIBILITY AND AUTHORITY OVER THE
FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND DEFENSE MATTERS OF MICRONESIA.

SUGGESTIONS AS TO FURTHER GUIDANCE REQUIRED.

Steve Rosenfelt of the Wash Post in a followup call re yesterday's Micronesia story asked for information on the status of the status negotiations, which I gave him. He asked if ~~newsthere~~ the news of the Woodward story had yet reached the TT and whether there had been any reported TT reaction. I said it was probably now reaching the TT via the Guam Pacific Daily News, which has wire services, or Micronesia News Service. However we had no news yet of any reaction. He asked if I would speculate as to its likely impact on the TT. I said I wouldn't.
