Since the statement is meaningless and makes the client feel more satisfied, it appears to be a statement to be repeated at all times and in all places. Congressman Burton, by the way, thought your Marianas Constitution superb. At the time when he spoke with us he was saying it did not have any provision in it concerning wiretapping as the Guam Con-It turned out, although he didn't know this, stitution did. that the Marianas Constitution and the Guam Constitution provisions are identical at this point on the issue.
