PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE II, SECTION 11

It is proposed that article II, section 11 of the draft Constitution be amended to read as follows:

Section 11: Legislative Compensation. The members of the legislature shall receive an annual salary of-twelve-thousand-dollars-and-such-reasonable allowances-for-expenses-as-may-be-provided-by-law.—The-salary-of-members may-be-increased-no-more-frequently-than-ence-every-four-years-and-only-upon the-recommendation-of-an-advisory-commission-to-be-established-by-law-to study-and-make-recommendations-concerning-the-compensation-of-Gommonwealth executive;—legislative-and-judicial-officers.—No-increase-in-the-salary-of the-members-of-the-legislature-shall-apply-to-the-legislature-which-enceted the-same; as provided by law. The salary of members of the legislature may be neither increased nor diminished during the term for which they were elected.
