# HIMETEENTH DAY

Suburday, July 5, 3905

The Second Constitutional Convention of the Morehern Mariana Assignabus called to order at 10:13 a.m., Saturday, July 5, 1995, at the Convention Hall - House of Taga, Can Vicente, Saipan, Commonwealth of the Morthern Mariana Islands.

The Honorable Harman T. Guerraro, Brasidant, prosided.

A moment of silent prayer or meditation was observed.

The Convention Secretary called the roll, and 23 delegates were present. Delegate Hafnas was absent.

Secretary Mabors: Mr. President, a quorum is present.

<u>President H. Guerrero</u>: We have a majority and a quorum to conduct the Order of Business.

<u>Delegate DI.</u> Guerrero: Hr. President, let the record show that the delegate who is not here be officially excused, please.

President H. Guerrero: Delegate Mafnas earlier called and said he's ill today, so he's excused. Before I call on Floor Leader Lizama, you have in front of you is a summary journal of the before. The Chair has instituted this because we are behind with the verbatim journal so this would at least give us the summary of what had transpired the day before. Some minor amendments or changes or Type errors. It should be July 5th instead of July 6th. And on the third line of the first paragraph, the first word "voice" should be "roll call vote", and going up one line, the fourth line from the bottom of the first paragraph, the delegates unanimously adopted the proposed amendment, insert "proposed amendment" and after "amendment," insert "as amended." And on the fourth line of the second paragraph, that "he had not," "not" is missing there, "been allowed to speak." And on line 7, beginning of that sentence "the Chairs states," instead of "states," it sould read "stated." Floor Leader Lizama?

President H. Guerrero: In front of you, under Communications, is Legal Opinion No. 24, in reference to qualifications for holding public office and for voting. If there's no comment on that one, I would call on Chairman Manglena.

Delegate Villagomez: Mr. President?

President H. Guerrerc: Yes, Delegate Villagomez?

<u>Delegate Villagomez</u>: Just for the journal, I'd like to state that I disagree with the opinion of the attorney under Opinion No. 24.

<u>President H. Guerrero</u>: Any other discussions? If none, Committee Reports. Chairman Manglona?

### COMMITTEE REPORT/RECOMMENDATIONS

Committee Recommendation No. 15, from the Committee on Personal Rights and Natural Resources, recommending for adoption of the proposed amendment to Section 3(b) of Article II relating to composition of the House of Representatives and to delete Section 11 of the Schedule on Transitional Matters relating to Saipan Election Districts.

Committee Recommendation No. 16, from the Committee on Personal Rights and Natural Resources, recommending for adoption of the proposed amendment to Art le XVIII, Section 5(a) to allow proposed amendments to be ratified in a special election.

<u>Chairman Manglona</u>: Mr. President, your Committee on Local Government has nothing to report, however, I would like to inform that the proposals state that the proposals state to be assed out.

<u>President H. Guerrero</u>: Delegate Hanglona, did you say it has been passed out?

Chairman Manglona: Yes.

President H. Guerrero: Chairman Lizama?

Chairman Lizama: Hr. President, the Committee on Governmental Institutions has nothing to report at this time.

President H. Guerrero: Chairman Guerrero?

<u>Chairman DL. Guerrero</u>: Mr. President, likewise, your Committee on Finance and Other Matters has no written report at this time.

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Chairman King: Hr. President, the Committee on Personal Rights and Natural Resources would like to report to the Convention, Committee Recommendation No. 15 and Committee Recommendation No. 15.

President H. Guerrero: The Chair receives Committee Recommendation Mos. 15 and 16. Any other committee reports? If none, we're under Entroduction and First Reading. I would like to call on Chair as Ting to seed the titles of Committee Recommendation Mos. 15 and 16.

# INTRODUCTION ADD FIRST DEADING AND REFERRAL OF TREPOSIAS

Chairman King: Thank you, Er. President.

President M. Guerrero: Excuse me.

Chairman DL. Guerrero: Are we not going to adopt the Committee Recommendations that were submitted?

President H. Guerrero: We don't adopt them. They are submitted until we get down to the General Orders for debate.

Chairman DL. Guerrero: When are we going to adopt the Committee Recommendations?

President H. Guerrero: I believe under the Robert's Rules, the Committee is supposed to report or submit it to the Chair and it will be under discussions under the General Orders of the Day. It will be placed under the General Orders of the Day.

Chairman DL. Guerrero: My question is, when are we going to adopt the Committee's reports? Since the Committee's reports are readily available at this L. e, I think the Convention should either adopt the Committee's reports and then they could come in and introduce them for First Reading.

<u>Delegate Villagomez</u>: In the alternative, the President can state that it accepts the Committee Rejurt and then it becomes the property of the Convention

President H. Guerraro: Can you repeat your statement?

<u>Delegate Villagomes</u>: In the alternative for the record that the Chair receives and accepts the Committee Recommendations as part of the record of the Convention.

Chairman DL. Guerrero: What you're saying is that the President himself can accept? Is this true?

Delegate Villagomez: That's correct.

President H. Guerrero: Under the Robert's Rules, I believe this is the version, page 422, is equivalent to terms in correct motion as applied to

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the Assembly. It is usually best to use the word "adopt", however, since it is the least likely to be misunderstood, a common error is to move that the report be received after it has been read apparently on the supersession that such a motion is necessary in order for the report to be taken under consideration or to be recorded as having been made. In fact this motion is meaningless since the report has already been received. Even before a report has been read, a motion to receive it is necessary if the time for its reception is established by the Order of Business or life to member objects.

Chairman DL. Guerrero: That's what I'm saying, if there's no member objected.

<u>President H. Guerrero</u>: Are you rejecting? We did that on the other reports and I thought we had an understanding that the Chair will accept the report and then depate it under the General Orders.

Chairman DL. Guerrero: Well, Mr. President, if there's no objection on the floor, then I think we can proceed, but am quite lost on this. There are several committee reports that the Convention has adopted first before they are even taken up.

President H. Guerrero: My problem is that if we adopt this report, in reality it's like a resolution. We adopt it, then it comes under the General Orders for debate and then we throw it out basically because the report is with the attachment also.

Chairman DL. Guerrero: What you're saying is that the report with the Committee's recommendation that we have to take up, or just only the committee report itself that the committee is reporting to the Convention that the Committee's commendation is hereby attached with this report?

<u>President H. Guerrero</u>: That's right. But if we adopt the text, it becomes, in effect, the act or the statement of the Ac ably. If we adopt it right now, we're basically saying that we're adopting Committee Recommendation No. 15.

Chairman DL. G. \_\_\_\_: Well, I have no quarrel, Mr. President, except to clarify ful that at least the Committee is already reporting it out to this Convention and of course the recommendation may not be attached to the Committee's report.

<u>President H. Guerrero:</u> Does anyone has any objection for the Chair just receiving the reports?

Delegate Villanueva: No objection.

<u>President H. Guerrero</u>: These Recommendations will be placed under the General Orders of the Day on tomorrow's Order of Business for debate. Delegate Villanueva?

Delegate Villanueva: I have no objection, but there are only four

Chairman King: Thank you, Mr. President. <u>Delegate Villagomez</u>: Correction. That should be 3(b) instead of 3(a); 3(b) of Article II.

Chairman King; 3(b), I'm sorry.

President H. Guerrero: Can you read the title of Committee Recommendation No. 16?

Chairman King: Committee Recommendation No.16, with respect to Delegate Proposal Nos. 77-85 and 112-85: "To amend Article XVIII, Section 5(a) to allow proposed amendments to be ratified in a special election."

<u>President H. Guerrero</u>: Thank you, Chairman King. This has been considered as First Reading of these two Committee Recommendations.
