A PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

To amend Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of Article VI and Sections 17(a) and (b) of Article III and to propose a new Section 7 of Article VI of the Constitution of the Northern Mariana Islands relating to Local Government.

THE SECOND CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION ADOPTS AND PROPOSES FOR RATIFICATION THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS:

1 I. Article VI is amended to read:

- "Section 1: <u>Local Government</u>. Agencies of local government shall be established as provided by this article.
 - "Section 2: Election of Mayor. The qualified voters from Rota, Tinian and Aguiguan, and the islands north of Saipan shall elect a mayor for each island or group of islands.
 - "a) A mayor shall be qualified to vote in the island or islands served by the mayor, at least twenty-five years of age, a resident and domiciliary of the Commonwealth for at least three years immediately preceding the date on which the mayor takes office, and must reside in the island or islands served by the mayor after election, and must meet other qualifications provided by law. No person convicted of a felony in the Commonwealth or in an area under the jurisdiction of the United States may be eligible for this office unless a full pardon has been granted.
 - "b) The mayor shall be elected at a regular general election for a term of office of four years and shall not be eligible to hold that office for more than two terms. A vacancy in the office of the mayor shall be filled by special election if

1 one-half or more of the term remains and otherwise as 2 provided by law. 3 "c) The office of the mayor for Saipan shall remain as provided in this Constitution until four years after the ratification of this amendment, at which time, it shall cease to exist and the offices of precinct commissioners shall be established as 7 provided in this Article. "Section 3: Responsibilities and Duties of the Mayor. 10 "a) A mayor shall serve on the governor's 11 council as established by Section 5 of this Article. 12 "b) A mayor shall administer government 13 programs, public services and appropriations provided 14 by law for the island or islands served by the mayor 15 and shall report quarterly to the governor relating 16 to these programs and services or appropriations. 17 "c) A mayor may investigate complaints and 18 conduct public hearings with respect to government 19 operations and local matters, and may submit 20 findings or recommendations to the governor and the 21 legislature. A mayor may require information in 22 writing relating to local matters as may be necesary 23 for his investigation under this subsection. "d) The mayors of Rota and Tinian and Aguiguan, 24 25 in consultation with the Municipal Council, and the

1	mayor of the islands north of Saipan shall submit
2	items for inclusion in the proposed budgets for both
3	government operations and capital improvement
4	projects. The governor's budget submission to the
5	legislature shall state his disposition of the
6	budgetary requests contained in the submissions
7	from Rota, Tinian and Aguiguan, and the islands
8	north of Saipan.
9	"d) A mayor shall coordinate any extension of
10	federal programs extended to the island or islands
11	served by the mayor.
12	"f) A mayor shall act as the principal local
13	official for coordinating activities with disaster
14	control for the mobilization of resources and
15	meeting emergency conditions in his/her respective
16	senatorial district.
17	"g) The mayors of Rota and Tinian and
18	Aguiguan shall appoint, in consultation with the
19	respective Executive Branch Department head, all
20	resident department heads.
21	"h) A mayor shall perform other responsibilities
22	as provided by law.
23	"Section 4: Compensation. A mayor shall receive an
24	annual salary plus an allowance for reasonable expenses
25	as provided by law.
26	"Section 5: Governor's Council. The mayors
27	elected under Section 2, the executive assistant
28	appointed under Article III, Section 18, and the chief

1	precinct commissioners shall be members of a
2	governor's council that shall advise the governor on
3	government operations and local matters. The
4	governor shall preside over the council which shall
5	meet regularly or at least four times each year
6	to consider matters concerning the relationship
7	between the Commonwealth and its separate islands.
8	"Section 6: Municipal Council/Precinct
9	Commissioners.
10	"a) There shall be Municipal Councils for
11	Rota and Tinian and Aguiguan to be composed of
12	three (3) members, elected at large on a non-partisan
13	basis. Candidates for municipal council shall be
14	at least twenty-one (21) years of age, a resident
15	of the municipality for three (3) years and shall
16	serve for a period of two (2) years. The Council
L 7	shall adopt its own Rules of Procedure.
18	"b) Four years after the ratification of this
L9	amendment, there shall be precinct commissioners
20	for Saipan to be composed of four (4) members,
21	elected by precincts. Candidates for Precinct
22	Commissioners shall be at least twenty-one (21)
23	years of age, a resident of the precinct for at
24	least three years immediately preceding the date on
25	which the precinct commissioners takes office, and

shall serve for a period of four (4) years. Immediately upon taking office, the four (4) precinct commissioners shall meet and select a chief commissioner by drawing of lots. The chief commissioner shall serve for a period not to exceed one year. Each of the four precinct commissioners shall serve alternately as chief every year throughout the four year term. In the case of a vacancy, the governor shall appoint the unsuccessful candidate for the office in the last election who received the next highest number of votes. Otherwise, the governor shall appoint a person from that precinct with the advice and consent of the precinct legislative delegation to the house of representatives.

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"Section 7: Powers, Meetings, Compensation.

"a) The Municipal Councils shall meet in regular session no more than twice a month, and shall be paid for each meeting as provided by law. The mayor, or a majority of the Council, may call special sessions of the Council as needed. The powers of the Municipal Council shall extend to all local matters of a predominately local nature not pre-empted by the Commonwealth Legislature, and shall include the following:

1	"1) Assist the mayor in the formulation
2	of the annual budget delineating local need,
3	"2) At the request of a department
4	head, in consultation with the mayor, the
5	council shall have the authority to approve
6	reprogramming of funds in the approved
7	budget, .
8	"3) To confirm all resident department
9	heads,
10	"4) When a mayor is unable to discharge
11	the duties of office by reason of physical
12	or mental disability, the presiding officer
13	of the Municipal Council shall be acting mayor.
14	If the presiding officer is not available,
15	another member shall be selected to serve, and
16	"5) Additional powers and duties as
17	provided by law.
18	"b) The precinct commissioners shall meet in
19	regular session no more than twice a month and
20	shall receive an annual salary as provided by law.
21	The mayor of Saipan, or a majority of the precinct
22	commissioners, may call special sessions as needed.
23	The powers of the precinct commissioners shall
24	extend to all matters of a predominately local nature
25	not pre-empted by the Commonwealth Legislature, and

1	shall include the following:
2	"1) Assist the Mayor in the formulation of
3	the annual budget delineating local needs,
4	"2) Advise the Mayor in the reprogramming
5	of funds in the approved budget,
6	"3) Serve as liaison between their
7	respective precincts and the office of the Mayor
8	in the delivery of public services,
9	"4) When a Mayor is unable to discharge the
10	duties of office by reason of physical or mental
11	disability, the presiding officer of the precinct
12	commissioners shall be acting mayor. If the
13	presiding officer is not available, another
14	member shall be selected to serve, and
15	"5) Additional powers and duties as
16	provided by law.
17	"Section 8. Section 6 of Article VI is hereby amended
19	to read as follows:
20	"a) The chartered municipality form of local
21	government on Rota and Tinian is hereby established.
22	Local taxes paid to the chartered municipal government
23	of Rota and Tinian may be expended for local purposes
24	on the island or islands producing those revenues. New
25	agencies of local government may not be established

without the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the persons qualified to vote from the island or islands to be served by the proposed agency of local government."

Section 9: Sections 17(a) and (b) of Article III are amended to read:

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"Section 17(a). The governor shall delegate to a mayor elected under the provisions of Article VI, Section 2, responsibility for the execution of Commonwealth laws as deemed appropriate, and the administration of public services in the island or islands in wihch the mayor has been elected. Services being provided on a decentralized basis on Rota, and Tinian and Aguiguan on the effective date of this amendment shall continue. In furtherance of this Section, the mayor shall have the responsibility for ensuring that the resident department heads faithfully execute their duties under the law and in accordance with the policies of the Commonwealth government for the administration of public services, in the islands in which the mayor has been elected."

"b) Public services on Rota, and Tinian and and Aguiguan shall be headed by a resident department head in the department providing the services. A resident department head shall submit a budget to the mayor pursuant to the budget instructions. No resident

1	department head may be appointed to serve in any
2	commonwealth-wide board, commission, or authority.
3	These arrangements shall apply to the islands north
4	of Saipan when the population of these islands exceeds
5	five thousand persons.
6	"Section 10. <u>Election</u> . An election of the members
7	of the municipal council shall be held within sixty (60)
8	days after the ratification of this amendment. The
9	Board of Election shall conduct the election in
10	accordance with existing laws."
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
