REPORT TO THE CONVENTION BY THE COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL INSTITUTIONS

Subject: Committee Recommendation No. 64

Your Committee on Governmental Institutions recommends that the Convention meeting in Committee of the Whole adopt the attached proposed constitutional amendment relative to public education in the Commonwealth.

Your Committee's recommended constitutional amendment would establish an independent board of education to administer the elementary and secondary schools and an independent Northern Marlanas College under a board of regents to provide for adult and continuing education, postsecondary and adult vocational education and professional training. The board of education would have from five to seven members, four of whom would be elected on a nonpartisan basis. One member would be elected from Rota, one member would be elected from Tinian, and two members would be elected from Saipan. The Governor would appoint at least one member and could appoint as many as three if necessary to ensure that at least one member is a woman and at least one member is a person of Carolinian descent.

Your Committee's recommendation also requires that the educational system recognize our cultural heritage and language needs while preparing our children for participation in the world at large. The proposed constitutional amendment also guarantees a minimum budget to the elementary and secondary school system and to the college in order to ensure that sufficient resources are dedicated to the educational needs of our people.

<u>Delegate Proposals</u>: Your Committee on Governmental Institutions considered Delegate Proposal Nos. 32-85, 33-85, 106-85, 117-85, 182-85, 193-85 214-85 and 266-85 and determined that the attached Committee Recommendation represents the best approach.

Therefore, your Committee strongly urges all delegates to support the attached committee recomendation.

64

A PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

To repeal Section 13 of Article III, and to amend Article XV relative to education.

BE IT ADOPTED BY THE SECOND CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION:

Upon ratification pursuant to Section 5 of Article XVIII of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Constitution and Public Law No. 4-30, the Constitution of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Is amended as follows:

- Effective on the second Monday of January 1988, Section 13
 of Article III is repealed.
 - II. Effective on the second Monday of January 1988, Article XV is amended to read:

"ARTICLE XV: EDUCATION

Section 1. Elementary and Secondary Education.

- a) Every person in the Northern Mariana Islands shall have the right to free, compulsory and public elementary and secondary education within age and educational levels provided by law. The educational system shall recognize the distinct and unique cultural heritage and indigenous way of life of the people and shall be committed to provide for the language needs of the people and the preservation of cultural integrity within a global community.
- b) Administration of the public elementary and secondary system of the Commonwealth shall be the responsibility of a superintendent of education appointed by a representative board of education. The board of education shall formulate policy and exercise control over

the public school system through the superintendent.

Other matters pertaining to its operations and duties shall be provided by law.

c) The board of education shall have not less of than five or more than seven members, one of whom shall be elected on a nonpartisan basis from the first senatorial district, one of whom shall be elected on a nonpartisan basis from the second senatorial district, two of whom shall be elected on a nonpartisan basis from the third senatorial district, and the remainder of whom shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent, the senate. At least one member of the board of education shall be a woman and at least one member shall be a person of Carolinian descent. d) A member of the board of education shall be qualified to vote in the Commonwealth, at least

twenty-five years of age, and a resident and domicillary
of the Commonwealth for at least five years immediately
preceding the date on which the member takes office. A
longer residency and domicile requirement may be provided

by law.

e) The public elementary and secondary education system shall be guaranteed an annual budget of not less than fifteen percent of the general revenues of the Commonwealth.

Section 2. Higher and Adult Continuing Education.

- a) The legislature shall establish by law a Northern Marianas College that shall be headed by a president. The president of the college shall be appointed by a representative board of regents. The board of regents shall be appointed to staggered terms by the governor and shall formulate policy and exercise control over the college through the president. The composition of the board of regents and other matters pertaining to its operations and duties shall be provided by law.
- b) The mission of the college shall be to provide the best quality and meaningful postsecondary and adult educational opportunities for the purpose of improving the quality of life for the individual and for the Commonwealth as a whole. The college shall be responsible for providing education in the areas of adult and continuing education, postsecondary and adult vocational education and professional development for the people of the Commonwealth.
- c) The college shall be guaranteed an annual budget of not less than one percent of the general revenues of the Commonwealth.
