Dear Jun:

Hafa adai -- kao mamauleg ha hao? Work here has been very much on the ball irregardless of the lack of funds, we continue to do what we are supposed to. The amendments, inclusive of the Chamorro and Carolinian translation are now being printed for dissemination to the voters and the public education program will officially begin October 1, beginning at Koblerville area and moving northward each day. Hope all will go well and the public are well-educated on the issues of the amendments.

We had several difficulties from day one after you left because of the lack of funds for the Post Convention and then not having the chairman to run the show. Jack Torres was appointed coordinator, but left most of the time -- God knows where. Often times I have problems with my work because I have to be in two places at one time -- Post Con and CRM's. Now, I am back to Post Con again and one only knows what will my employment status be at CRM.

I am enclosing job orders, purchase requisition forms and several personnel actions for your signatures. The job orders are necessary for the printing and reproduction of the journals and documents of the ConCon at DOE and the personnel action forms are needed in order to record the termination of the ConCon employees. The purchase requisition forms are for the purchase of supplies as well as for the payment of the MITA billing for the xerox machine and xerox copies made at their office. I know that you signed several purchase requisition forms before you left but somehow Mertie must have misplaced them and I cannot locate them in the office. There is no one left here except Louise, Rita and myself. The accounts of all transactions made during the Convention days and the days after are all in a mess and I am putting them all together in the best way I can think of so that when we are audited, it will show that you and I did our best to keep all in their proper order. I am really mad at Mertie because of the confidence you have on her and she did not really keep the records in the best possible accounting that she can do. Also, there is an amended job order for Department of Public Works. Somehow the POL services at DPW was overrun by some \$99.00 and some odd cents. Before cutting this job order, I checked with Dave Igitol and worked with him for several days in trying to get our records straight and what should I do in order to get it closed. He advised me to get in touch with you at the earliest possible time, mail you some documents for your signature and process all outstanding bills against the 1711 account before you finally write to Finance to advise them that the account is officially closed. According to Dave as of yesterday, we have at least till the end of November to officially close the account because that is the decision reached by government officials at their last meeting, although the fiscal year closes September 30. Because time is of the essence, Dave suggested that I get the forms to you at the earliest possible time and have you return them to me so that we can obligate the funds as soon as possible. Jun, rest assured that I am not going to blow you -- what I mean is that I am not going to be contracting or obligating funds left to right without my letting you know for what. The present balance that we have with Finance on the 1711 account is \$28,976.38. Of these funds, we can obligate for the printing and reproduction, the billing to MITA, the POL and that for Amalia's contract.

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Regarding Amalia's contract, I guess you have received the telex that we sent you sometime last week. I do not know how you feel about it but I guess she really needs her money. The journals are all done now and we are just proofreading them before finalization and we mail them to you for your signature. Nabors still has the days one through eighteen and he has not return them to us. I do not know why, he has dropped by the office several times and he refuses to send them to us nor deliver them to us unless we give him the \$500.00. Jun, as much as I hate to interfere, but, honestly he does not deserve the payment at all. He has not done any proofreading at all -- we even proofread the journals for the days one through eighteen. The last time he came to the office, which was last week Thursday, he signed the other days that we have here and left. Dave Igitol also refuses to pay him because like I said, Dave wants you to approve all requests for payments, and this should be the case because the law is very clear that you are the only authorized signator against the account. Jack Torres wants to cancel Nabors contract; however, the decision is really yours because only you can act either way on such matter.

I am still trying to get a phone to our office, as yet, I have not been able to. However, we are still using the phones at Board of Elections and Personnel.. The numbers are, in case you forget, 6880 (BOE) and 6925/7327 (Personnel). If you want to get hold of me after working hours, call me at home at 6347 -- you can call me collect. I would love to talk to you.

Politics is really hot these days and I am getting confused. I have not played an active role in any political party -- I want to be in the middle because I do not want to jeopardize the Convention's work because of my involvement with politics -- you know how crazy our people are. Well you know how politics are here -- gof kuchino lai ombres mana sin magagao ha i taotao debatde.

We all miss you here at work -- your sweet personality and good working relationship is far in comparison with our present coordinator. I always quarrel with him, but I still survive. I do a lot of the work and then he comes and bull shit with me -- no free ride man, I can hack it.

I hope I explain myself well regarding the enclosed forms. If there is any question, please call me right away -- call collect, I do not mind paying so that we can resolve these matters once and for all. Also, another package is included for your signatures on the journals that we have available in final form. I have not had the time to proofread it again for the second time but I will do so upon its return. Also enclosed is a certification for payment on Amalia's contract. It is up to you whether to certify it or not -- I know you want her to finish the journals before you pay her. I only wonder why she is taking this long to finish it. The others still pending here were only in draft forms when she brought them in. As they come in, I am going to DHL them to you.
