We all know that the candidates we elect to political office will affect our lives for the next 2, 4, or 6 years. Just remember that the Constitutional amendments that are ratified on election day will affect not only our own lives, but those of future generations as well.

Please give these proposed amendments the attention they deserve and vote wisely on November 3, 1985.
