The Committee on Legislative Branch and Public Finance of the Third Northern Marianas Constitutional Convention will conduct an initial Public Hearing on <u>Thursday, June 22, 1995</u>, at 1:30 p.m., at the Senate Chamber, Capitol Hill, Saipan. The purpose of the public hearing is to hear and receive testimony on **Proposed Amendments to Article II (Legislative Branch) of the CNMI Constitution.** 

There is considerable support in the Committee for amendments that would reduce the size of the Senate from 9 to 6 members with the Lieutenant-Governor as Presiding Officer, would reduce the size of the House to 13 members, with 11 elected at large from Saipan, would increase the term of a representative to 4 years and a senator to 6 years, and would limit the entire legislative budget to 2% of the Commonwealth's annual revenue collections, out of which would be paid the legislators' salaries, withone half of the remainder used to pay for professional staff and the other half split among the members to pay the expenses of their offices.

The Public Hearing will be open to the general public. Persons wishing to testify are urged to inform the Committee and to submit written testimony to Chairman Tomas B. Aldan. office of the Third Constitutional Convention, Legislative Bureau, Capitol Hill, at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled hearing date. In accordance with Rule 30 of the Third Constitutional Convention's Rules of Procedure, no person shall be denied the opportunity to testify for lack of a written statement.
