



Third Northern Mariana Islands Constitutional Convention -1561-

Delegate Proposal No. 619

Date: July 10, 1995

It is proposed that a constitutional amendment be prepared that does the following:

Provides a right to a drug-free school.

Provides a right to a drug-free work place.

[Note: Mr. Baka explains that the right to a clean and healthful environment does not reach the drug problem and he suggests that Article I be expanded to deal with this area. He states that measures taken to achieve this goal may be construed to contradict other constitutional rights concerning search and seizure and privacy. Thus, for the protection of employers, employees, and to promote treatment, limits would be placed on the use of drug tests.]
