Dear Honorable Ogunoro:

In regards to your letter dated 13 June 1995, Pagan is still not safe for permanent resettlement. We have recommended approval for the establishment of the Pagan Island Marine Youth Camp on the condition that they meet two requirements: (1) prepare an Evacuation Plan for all personnel and (2) have one person from our office install and monitor a portable seismograph. The Evacuation Plan must establish a boat, ship, or aircraft large enough to accommodate all personnel on sight at all times should the need for immediate evacuation arise.

Mt. Pagan remains active. Our office records minor tremors and ashes, gas, and smoke spewing into the air on a regular basis. These activities make the Island unsafe for permanent habitation.

Crime and corruption were virtually unknown - they were living a moralistic life with malice toward none. But "progress" has changed all that. Yes, now it is a life of "Pot," "Ice" and Budweiser.

Saipan is now a microcosm of crime-ridden America with its Political corruption, rampant alcoholism, drug addicts as young as ten years of age, rapists, thievery and sex perversion and hostility towards Christian morals. At the present rate of drug abuse we will be over-run with mush-brained addicts and AIDS carriers within one generation. Many of our youth are no longer taught Christian morals, Patriotism, and obedience, and to respect their elders. However, I thank God that not all of our youth have fallen - and that is the group that I am interested in working with - let's keep the good kids good.

At our camp the youth will be taught spiritual values, self confidence, respect for our natural environment, and self preservation in the jungles and boonies of Pagan Island. 

We received your correspondence inquiring about the safety on the island of Pagan. Currently, we occasionally record activities on the island caused by Mt. Pagan. These activities range from minor tremors to ashes, gas and smoke spewing into the air.

In close consultation with seismologist from the Hawaii Volcano Observatory, a camp can be established on the island if we require Mr. Cabaldon to have an Evacuation Plan for all personnel and atleast one personnel from this office to install and monitor a portable seismograph. For the Evacuation Plan, a boat, chip or an aircraft large enough to accomodate all personnel, must be on sight at all times for immediate evacuation should the need arise.

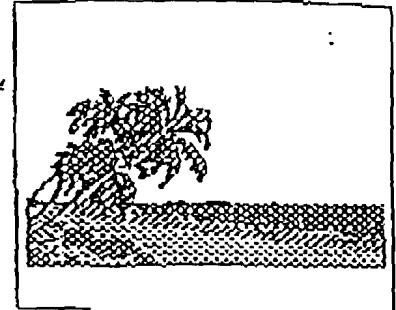

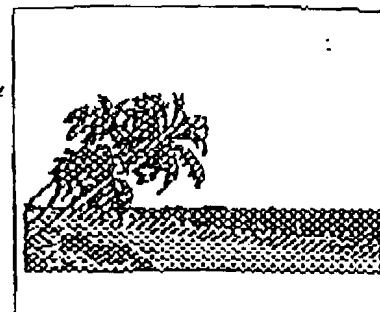


