Re: Summary of Statistical Data

Dear Deanne:

I have prepared a summary of the statistical data that may help analyze the data I submitted to you in the last few days. The migration patterns to the NMI are fairly well documented. While not summarized, the materials also show the outward bound migration as well.

Also, please note that my earlier submissions regarding the Guam born Chamorro are confirmed by the 1930 Japanese census showing that 15.4% of the Chamorros in the NMI were born in Guam. (471 out of a population of 3829) Clearly, this class included individuals young enough to have children after 1950 or, even, 1960.



D. Reports indicate that approximately 2,000 births and 500 deaths occurred in the Trust Territory during the year ending June 30, 1953. Information on stillbirths, maternal deaths and deaths by age group are not available. Data by age group are particularly difficult to obtain since many people do not know their exact age. Plans are now being made to meet the need for more complete information on births and deaths by expansion and development of the registration system.

E. There was no immigration or emigration during the year. There are no statistics available concerning internal migration.

Birth and death statistics

There were 1,564 births and 450 deaths reported for the trust territory in calendar year 1953. Information on stillbirths and maternal deaths is not available. A total of 91 infant deaths was reported, giving an infant mortality rate of 58.1.

No accurate detailed statistics are yet available; however, it is estimated that those indigenous persons who can neither read nor write simple materials in the vernacular are about 20 percent of the adult population.

D. Birth and death statistics

There were 1,654 live births and 312 deaths reported for the trust territory in calendar year 1954. This includes data for the Marshalls and Carolines and an estimate for Rota based on reports for part of the year. Information on maternal deaths is not available. Totals of 46 stillbirths and of 52 deaths under 1 year of age were reported for 1954. The infant mortality rate is 31.4 per 1,000 live births. These figures probably reflect some under-reporting. For Saipan the totals were 285 births and 48 deaths, of which 12 were under 1 year.

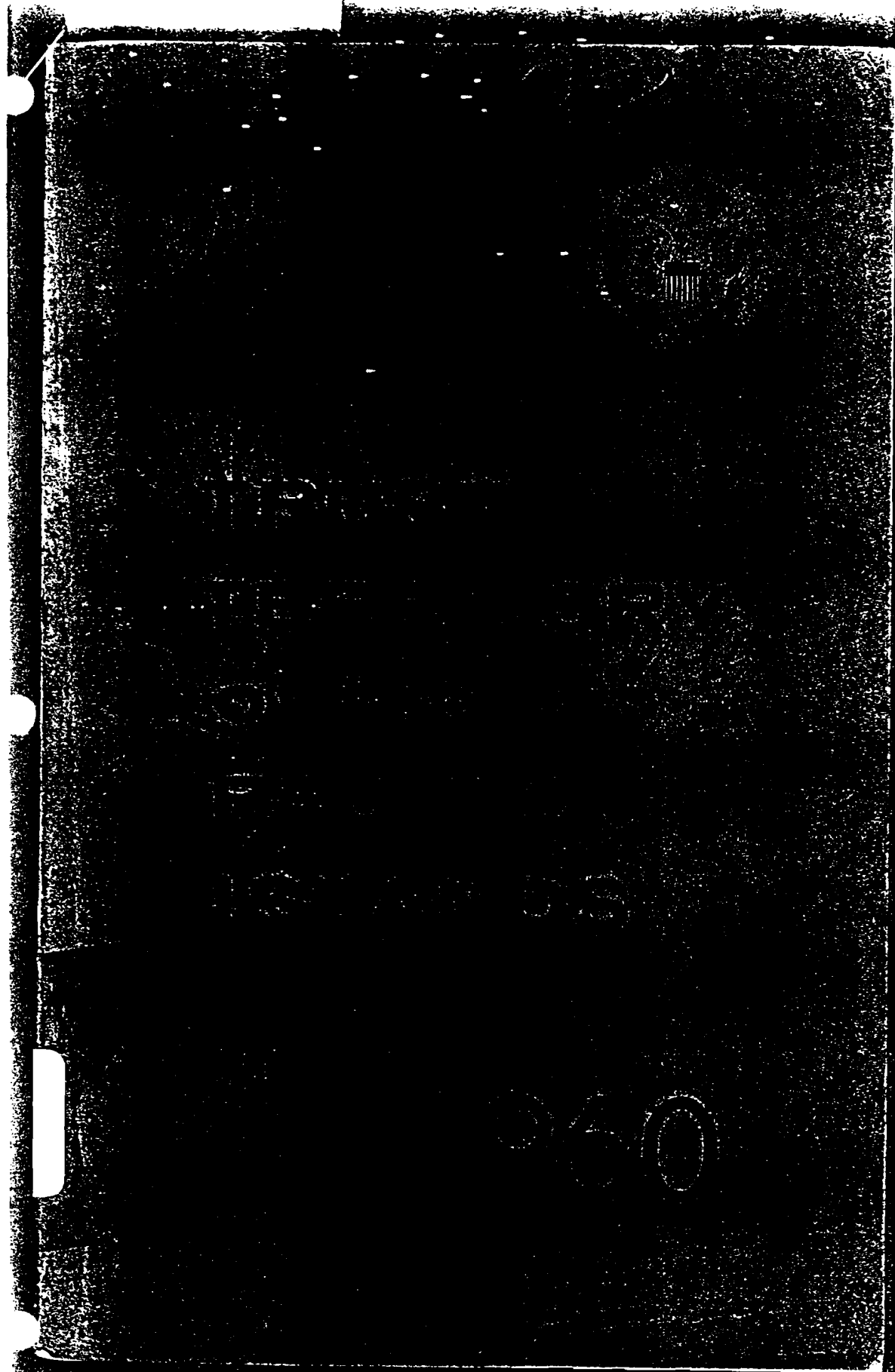
