Nichols' lawyer seeks to remove judge

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) - Terry Nichols' lawyer urged an appeals court Wednesday to remove the judge presiding over the Oklahoma bombing case because his chambers were damaged in the April 19 attack.

Michael Tigar filed the petition with the 10th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Denver, contending that U.S. District Judge Wayne Alley and the other judges in Oklahoma's Western District are too close to the bombing case. "We are staring in the face a fact - he is a victim," Tigar said

at a news conference.

Two weeks ago, Alley rejected a request from both the defense and the prosecution that he step aside. But he ordered the trial moved to Lawton, 90 miles (144 kilometers) away, because passions are running high in Oklahoma City.

The Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building is across the street from Oklahoma City's federal courthouse. Alley was not in the courthouse at the time of the blast, but his courtroom and chambers were damaged.

"There is no question that a reasonable person supplied with all the facts of this case would harbor doubts about Judge Alley's and the other Western

District judges' partiality," Tigar said in court papers.

The attack killed 169 people. Nichols and his co-defendant, Timo-

thy McVeigh, could get the death penalty.

McVeigh's lawyer did not Tigar in the appeal.

Smith taken out of suicide watch

COLUMBIA, South Carolina (AP) - Susan Smith has been removed from a suicide watch and placed with the general prison population to serve out her sentence for murdering her two sons by drowning them in a lake.

Ms. Smith now has a roommate, a job and eats with other inmates in the cafeteria at the Woman's Correctional Center in Columbia, Corrections Department spokeswoman Robyn Zimmerman said.

"She moved in last week and everything is fine," Ms. Zimmerman said on Wednesday. She would not identify Ms. Smith's roommate or her job.

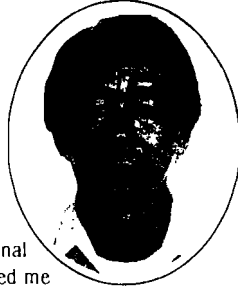
After her July conviction, Ms. Smith was on suicide watch in a cell monitored by closed-circuit

television and a guard who walked past every 15 minutes.

Ms. Smith, who is white, insisted that a black man had commandeered her car on Oct. 25, 1994. She begged tearfully on nationwide television for her sons' safe return, at last confessing Nov. 3 that she planned to commit suicide but let her car roll into the lake with her sons strapped inside.

Ms. Smith was convicted of two counts of murder and won't be eligible for parole for 30 years.

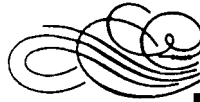

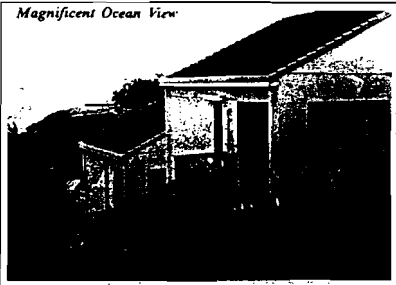
