Terrorist's death sparks unrest

LYON, France (AP) - Youths angered by the police killing of an Islamic radical suspected in France's terror bombings torched 20 vehicles overnight in continuing unrest, police said.

Scattered violence and vandalism that began last Friday when 24-year-old Algerian Khaled Kelkal was slain in a gun battle with police continued Tuesday night and early Wednesday.

Youths also set trash cans afire in the poor, heavily immigrant suburbs ringing Lyon, France's second-largest city. No injuries were reported by police, who arrested three young women and said they were stepping up patrols.

A total of 103 vehicles and nu-

merous trash cans have been burned or otherwise damaged since Kelkal's killing just outside Lyon by police paratroopers who had tracked him for weeks in a spectacular manhunt.

Violence also has spread to other French cities. In the eastern city of Mulhouse, youths burned cars and garbage bins and scattered debris across roads Monday night.

Kelkal's fingerprints were found Aug. 26 on a bomb that failed to explode along high-speed train tracks outside Lyon. That made him the prime suspect in six bombings and attempts that have killed seven people and injured over 100 since July 25.

Authorities suspect a connec-

tion between the bombings and an insurgency by Islamic militants in Algeria, a former French colony. Like Kelkal, many Muslim radicals are angry at France for supporting Algeria's military-installed government.

Though they had orders to take him alive, police fatally shot Kelkal as he continued firing at

them with an automatic weapon at a suburban bus stop in Vaulx-en-Velin. Kelkal grew up in the working-class Lyon suburb and used it as his militant power base.

The killing, captured by television crews and replayed on the evening news for millions of French, has angered Muslims.

Islamic groups had distanced

themselves from Kelkal and the wave of bombings that have terrorized France since midsummer. But many Muslims view Kelkal's death as unnecessary, and it has reignited tensions between police and France's Islamic community.

Police on Tuesday opened formal investigation into the killing.

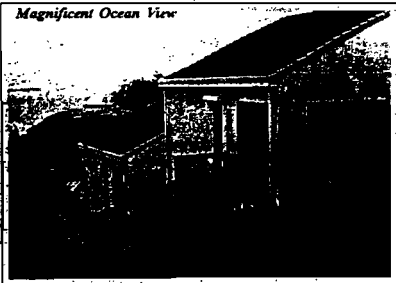

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR AN EMERGING MARKETS MANAGER

The Northern Mariana Islands Retirement Fund is soliciting proposals from qualified investment firms to manage a Combined Far East Asia ex-Japan Portfolio for the System's \$200 million pension fund. The Board of Trustees of the Fund anticipates placing approximately \$15 million in assets in this strategy. Managers wishing to be included in this search must meet the following minimum criteria:

- The principal business of the firm consists of rendering investment supervisory services as to the investment of funds on the basis of individual needs of each client.
- The principal ownership and control of the firm rests with individuals who are actively engaged in investment advisory business.
- The firm is registered as an investment advisor under the laws of the United States of America as from time to time are in effect.
- The firm has continuously engaged in investment advisory business for a period of ten or more years.
- The firm certifies to the Board of Trustees, in writing, that the assets under its direct investment supervision are in excess of \$200 million.
- The contract between the Board and the investment advisor is of no specific duration and voidable at any time by either party.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The Office of the Public Auditor (OPA) is soliciting proposals for financial and compliance audit of the Marianas Public Land Corporation (MPLC) for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994. Proposals shall be submitted to the Public Auditor, P.O. Box 1399, Saipan, MP 96950, no later than 4:30 p.m. on October 20, 1995. Proposals must be stamped "Confidential" and labelled "MPLC FY 1994 Audit Proposal." The audit shall be performed in compliance with the following guidelines:

1. OMB Circular A-128
2. Government Auditing Standards
3. Other applicable Generally Accepted Auditing Standards

Proposals must at least have the following information:

Title Page:

- a.) Request for Proposal subject
- b.) Name of CPA or CPA firm
- c.) Local address and telephone number
- d.) Name of contact person and submission date

Transmittal Letter:

- a.) Briefly state your understanding of the audit work to be performed. Include an affirmative statement to perform the work within the time period specified.
- b.) State a comprehensive fee for which the audit will be performed.
- c.) State the scheduled dates for the entrance and exit conferences, and the submission of draft and final audit reports

Your Company's Profile:

- a.) Provide a brief description of your company which includes your personnel's educational background and experience, number of staff, level of staff (partners, managers, supervisor, etc.), and a listing of clients.
- b.) The description must also include an affirmative statement that at least the partners are certified public accountants
- c.) Name and profile of staff members to be assigned to the audit, should your firm be awarded

Awards will be based on four evaluation factors: price, technical competence, prior experience, and ability to meet the deadline.

The contract for this audit will be awarded not later than October 27, 1995. The audit work shall commence thereafter and final audit report shall be completed and delivered by 4:30 p.m. on February 9, 1996.
