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A LEGISLATIVE INITIATIVE

To propose a constitutional amendment to update the legislative budget ceiling to provide sufficient funding for an effective and independent legislative branch supported by professional and technical staff and appropriate resources, and guarantee an equitable distribution of funds for the personal staff and offices of each member of the legislature, so that each can function properly as an independent representative elected by the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TENTH NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

1	Section 1. Legislative Initiative. The Ninth Northern Marianas Commonwealth
2	Legislature, by the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members of each house present
3	and voting, hereby proposes the following amendment to the Constitution to be placed
4	before the people for ratification:
5	"A PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14	To amend Article II, Section 16 of the Commonwealth Constitution to update the legislative budget ceiling to provide sufficient funding for an effective and independent legislative branch supported by professional and technical staff and appropriate resources, and guarantee an equitable distribution of funds for the personal staff and offices of each member of the legislature, so that each can function properly as an independent representative elected by the people.
15	I. Article II, Section 16 is amended to read:
16	Section 16. Budget Ceiling. There shall be a ceiling on the budget of the
17	legislature.
18	a) Appropriations, or obligations and expenditures, exclusive of the
19	salaries of the members of the legislature, for the operations and activities
20	of the legislature, other than the salaries of members of the legislature, any
21	payments required by law to be made as an employer contribution to any
22	Commonwealth government retirement fund, and major equipment or
23	capital improvement projects, may not exceed two million eight hundred
24	thousand dollars in any fiscal year the budget ceiling computed as

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1	provided by this section.
2	b) Each member shall receive as a part of this ceiling one hundred
3	thousand dollars annually for office expenses including the expense of
4	travel outside the Commonwealth. Members may voluntarily pool all or
.5	any part of these funds.
6	c) The presiding officer in each house shall receive as a part of this
7	ceiling an additional four hundred thousand dollars a year to support the
8	operations and activities of that house, including the expense of travel
9	outside the Commonwealth.
10	d) The legislative bureau shall have a budget of not more that two
11	million dollars, for the purposes specified in section 17.
12	e) Beginning the second Monday of January 1998, the amount of
13	the ceiling and all other dollar amounts stated in this section shall be
14	adjusted every two years by the same percentage as the percentage change
15	in the United States Department of Commerce composite price index
16	during the two preceding fiscal years using the beginning of fiscal year
17	1996 as the base.
18	f) No part of the legislature's budget other than a member's salary
19	and benefits may be used for personal or political activities.
20	g) Obligations and expenditures for the operations and activities of
21	the legislature for the period October 1 through the second Monday in
2 2	January of a fiscal year in which there is a regular general election may not
23	exceed seven hundred thousand dollars or twenty five percent of the
24	annual spending authority otherwise available provided by law consistent
25	with this section. This ceiling shall apply to the various offices and
26	activities in the same proportions as the annual spending authority
27	provided by law consistent with this section.
28	II. Repealer.
29	Subsection (f) of Section 17 of Article II of the Commonwealth

31	Section 2. Adoption and Transmittal. The President of the Senate and the
32	Speaker of the House shall certify, and the Clerks of the Senate and House shall attest to

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to be transmitted to the Governor and the Board of Elections with instructions that the
