Delegate Proposal No. 119

Date: May 15, 1995

It is proposed that a constitutional amendment be prepared that does the following:

Deletes the current provisions with respect to the appointment and qualification of judges.

Provides that judges shall be 35 years of age, be a citizen of the United States, and possess other qualifications provided by law.

For the first term, a judge shall be appointed by the Governor and serve 6 years.

For subsequent terms, the question whether to retain the judge shall be put on the ballot. The judge shall be retained if 50% or more of the votes cast are in the affirmative. If retained, the judge shall serve 12 years.

Judges may serve until the age of 70.
