

Delegate Proposal No. 223

Date: June 2, 1995

It is proposed that a constitutional amendment be prepared that does the following:

Provides a term limit of three terms for Senators.

(Note: The current term of office for Senators is four years. This would provide for a total of 12 years in office.)

Deletes the authority of the legislature to change the constitutionally mandated residence and domicile requirements for Senators.

Provides a residence requirement that is the maximum allowed for the office of state senator under the U.S. Constitution.

Provides that a Senator must be domiciled in the Commonwealth.
