Com War series
objectives for M&U -

- (a) An orderly withdrawal of Military Government from direct participation in local government of the native communities; and in economic activities as a principal.
- (b) A radical cutback in the expenses of government as such.
- (c) A radical expansion of food production, including the swine, poultry, and cattle populations; with moderate subsidies as warranted where they will build up a permanent value.
- (d) Cutback of non-essential functioning, if any, now being carried on by Military Government. The Public Works budget should be the first point of attack.
- (e) Transfer of some of the costs of local government to the native population; with consequent decrease to Military Government. These costs need not be accepted by the native population (they may elect to decline the services).
- (f) Recovery or partial recovery of costs of public services such as transportation and electricity, by charges to those using the services.
- (g) Increase in retail trade outlets, and greater use of private enterprise in place of public employment; even where public employment might be more expeditious.
