1. In accordance with enclosure (1) the field trip party departed Saipan aboard the U.S.S. Hewell (AKL-14) at 1530K, 19 April 1951.
2. Arrived Alamagan Island 0630K, 20 April 1951.
 - a. It was too rough to go ashore at Sonsong Village.
 - b. Went to Partido Village. Two boats met the ship there. All the people were in Songsong Village.
 - c. Medical and school supplies were put aboard the boats.
 - d. No passengers to disembark or embark.
 - e. Natives were informed the school teachers checks would be left on the return trip between 2 - 5 May and for the people to be in the village where the water was the calmest.
 - f. Members of the boat crew alleged there was no sickness apparent on the island.
 - g. No food stuffs for this island.
 - h. Departed Alamagan 0658K, 20 April 1951.
3. Arrived Pagan Island 1045K, 20 April 1951.
 - a. Anchored off shore.
 - b. Disembarked 1 passenger.
 - c. Field Trip Officer ashore.
 - d. Commenced loading food stuffs for Agrihan.
 - e. The Field Trip Officer and Santiago Saures went to the other side of the island to try to locate a grave of an American Flyer shot down there during the war. After two hours of useless searching, not even finding the plane, they returned to the dock. Santiago Saures was left on the island with instructions to try to locate the grave.

- f. Embarked six passengers and their personal effects.
 - g. Departed Pagan Island 1415K, 20 April 1951.
4. Arrived Agrihan Island 1808K, 20 April 1951.
- a. Anchored off shore.
 - b. Disembarked seven passengers and their personal effects.
 - c. Commenced unloading food stuffs and supplies.
 - d. Field Trip personnel ashore. (See enclosures (2) and (3)).

e. The council meeting was held at 1915K, 20 April 1951. Present: Guillermo S. Taman, Chief Commissioner, Jose Mettau, Basilio Agon and Jose Magofna. The council requested that the Northern Marianas Development Co. furnish fifty (50) pieces of perforated steel, 18 inches by 12 feet to repair a bridge over which they transport copra. The people cannot defray the cost of the steel. They will use heavy timbers, but prefer steel. They feel the Northern Marianas Development Co. does not send up enough food. The Field Trip Officer informed the council of the ultimate turn over of the trusteeship of the islands from the Navy Department to the Interior Department. He thanked them for their cooperation during the Navy Department's sponsorship. Meeting adjourned.

f. During the course of the unloading of the food stuffs, about 2200K, the unloading party knocked off and did not want to continue. An investigation disclosed that they were mad at the Northern Marianas Development Co. They allege the Company is not complying with the terms of the verbal contract. They state the Company does not send them sufficient food. Further, they have received no cash from the company and they believe the value of the copra exported exceeds the value of the food and materials imported. After heated arguments among themselves they completed the unloading at or about 0200K, 21 April 1951.

- g. Departed from Agrihan Island 0555K, 21 April 1951.
5. Arrived Chichi Jima Island 1045K, 23 April 1951.
- a. Anchored off shore in the channel.

d. 1300K, 23 April 1951 held a community meeting and introduced POBST, F. A., SKC, USN, Military Government Representative of the Bonin-Volcano Islands and his family to the people. Chief Pobst's orders were read and he was installed in his assignment. Operation plans were discussed relative to unloading the ship and establishing the office and home of the Military Government Representative.

e. 24 April 1951. Commenced unloading cargo. 25 April 1951. Cargo unloading completed.

f. 25 April 1951. Commenced setting up Military Government Representative's office and home. The Commanding Officer of the U.S.S. Hewell (AKL-1*) is cooperating by assigning ship's company personnel to various details.

g. The council meeting was held at 1930K, 27 April 1951. Present: F. A. Pobst, SKC, USN, Military Government Representative, Jerry Savory, President, Grover Gilley, Frank Gonzales, Wilson Savory, Roderik Webb, and Rev. Greenway. The president welcomed Chief Pobst aboard and expressed his desire that the council, its members and the island inhabitants cooperate with the Military Government Representative. Endorsements on their petition for United States Citizenship were read and explained to their satisfaction. Food supply was discussed. Food import is inadequate. They can not pay for a sufficient quantity of food because they can not get fresh fish to market. They are in dire need of a reefer ship or a ship with reefer space. They are interested in having the regulations pertaining to catching turtles revised. The Military Government Representative will cause this to be the source of other correspondence. Rev. Greenway was appointed by the Field Trip Officer to assist the Military Government Representative in carrying out the Public Health Rules and Regulations and designated as Medical Practitioner on a non-revenue basis. Meeting adjourned.

h. 28 April 1951. Radio installation completed. Radio communication established with Guam this date.

i. 29 April 1951. Quonset hut erected; water system in Chief Pobst's house functioning; generators and reefers running.

j. 30 April 1951. Commenced loading ship for return trip.

k. Embarked six passengers.

l. Departed Chichi Jima Island 1800K, 30 April 1951.

6. Arrived Iwo Jima Island 0600K, 1 May 1951.

a. Discharged ships cargo.

b. Departed Iwo Jima Island 1200K, 1 May 1951.

7. Arrived Agrihan Island 0726K, 3 May 1951.

a. Anchored off shore.

b. Field Trip personnel ashore. (See enclosures (2) and (3)).

c. Embarked ten passengers.

d. Departed Agrihan Island 1015K, 3 May 1951

8. Arrived Pagan Island 1347K, 3 May 1951.

a. Anchored off shore.

b. Field Trip Officer ashore to check on plane which was shot down during the war. Contacted Santiago Saures. Found plane, but in different location from where previously looked. Unable to identify it. Could not take pictures. Santiago Saures could not locate the grave he allegedly help dig.

c. Embarked one passenger.

d. Departed Pagan Island 1511K, 3 May 1951.

9. Arrived Alamagan Island 1830K, 3 May 1951.

a. Due to rough weather the Field Trip Officer decided it was not safe to go ashore. The members of the council came aboard ship.

b. Field Trip personnel contacted council members aboard ship. (See enclosures (2) and (3)).

c. A council meeting was held aboard the U.S.S. Hewell (AKL-14) while it was underway in the vicinity of the island. Present: Igniaco Sablan Leon Guerrero, President, Manuel Cruz Madagolai, Pedro S. Blas, Jose Alden and Antonio M. Pangelinan. The people are desirous of obtaining land, about five (5) hectares per family. They want to know if they own land on Saipan if it can be exchanged for land on Alamagan. The people want a written contract with the Northern Marianas Development Company so they can determine just where they stand with the company. They allege the company is taking 30% of all copra sold. They want to know whether it is gross or net. (eg. before fees for hauling are taken out or after). They would like to notify the Northern Marianas Development Company that thirty-one (31) people desire to go to Pagan Island, the next time their ship goes there to work copra for a six month period. It was explained to the council that the Interior Department was relieving the Navy Department of its responsibilities to the Trust Territory on or about 1 July 1951. Meeting adjourned.

d. Disembarked council members.

e. Departed Alamagan Island 2345K, 3 May 1951.

10. Arrived Saipan 1330K, 4 May 1951.

a. Passengers disembarked.

b. Off loading completed by 1830K, 4 May 1951.
