A blood donors! pool for Japanese and Koreans has been functioning but volunteers have been difficult to obtain. The syphilis clinic has been treating an average of approximately 100 patients with positive Kahns during the quarter. A number of Tuberculin Tests were taken during the month of October. The percentages are far higher than among similar age groups in the United States and serve as a vivid illustration of the prevelence of Tubercolusis among these people.

### (d) Chamorro Dispensary (includes Carolinians).

General conditions continue to be satisfactory. The deworming program was completed during the month of November without complications.

#### 5. SANITATION.

Rigid mosquito control measures have been carried out throughout this period. Spraying with 5% DDT in kerosene has been carried out in the Japanese, Korean and Chalan Kanoa camps and in the Red Cross and Hospital areas. A number of cisterns and wells were filled in to prevent insect breeding. All GI cans continue to be sprayed daily to control fly breeding. A large number of rats and mice were trapped in all areas during this period. A sewage system is being constructed in Chalan Kanoa. Construction of ten (10) water flushing heads and one (1) septic tank has been started and is expected to be completed by the end of January.

Oba, has confessed to the murder of KASAI GIICHI and HARA HITSUGU. The signed confession and fatal weapons are in the hards of the Provost Marshal where the case is pending further action.
