Other than as specifically and directly authorized by competent military, naval, and civil government authority directly concerned, no person, group of individuals, corporation, company, organization, or activity, shall import, manufacture, produce, sell, deal in, dispense, give away, or maintain in possession, intoxicating liquor on the island of Saipan. Other than as specifically and directly authorized by competent military, naval, and civil government authority, or incident to prescription by a licensed physician, no person, group of individua corporation, company, organization or activity, shall import, manufacture, produce, sell, deal in, dispense, give away, maintain in possession, or use opium, heroin, coca leaves, or any compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, or preparation thereof, on the island of Saipan. No person who has not attained his, or her, twenty-first anniversary of birth, shall be served, accorded access to, sold, traded, or otherwise provided with, intoxicating liquor, on the island of Saipan. 4. In order to provide widespread dissemination of the above controls and prohibitions, the Commanding Officers of each Army activity are hereby requested to republish in Post and Station Regulations and Bills to all applicable activities.
