Subject: Commander in Chief Pacific and U. S. Pacific Fleet.

Reference: Saipan as the Seat of Government for the Trust Territory under the Department of the Interior.

(a) CincPacFlt ltr ser 2490 of 11 June 1946.

1. Saipan appears to be an excellent site for the seat of government of the Trust Territory in all respects except one — that it is at one extremity of the populated parts of the Trust Territory instead of in a central position. The Deputy High Commissioner, considered this factor to be of controlling importance.

2. The next central high island is Pagan, but that island lacks a serviceable air field, and the harbor has limitations. Next in order of suitability, so far as location is concerned, is Truk. The Truk anchorage is ample and Meen Island has a serviceable air field. The field is of limited capacity and is not receiving adequate maintenance.

3. The cost of providing the required facilities for government will be about the same at Saipan and at Truk, for neither place has any of the permanent buildings and facilities which will be required. If this transfer of government were to be made in the near future, some of the temporary buildings now on Saipan could serve as administrative offices and others could provide housing.

4. It is recommended that planning be on the basis that the seat of government of the Trust Territory will be at Truk, but that it may be necessary to set up the government initially at Saipan.
