Twentieth Air Force, subject: "Inactivation of Isely Air Force Base, Saipan, Marianas Islands," dated 25 March 1949. Discontinuance of air operations was effected on 26 March 1949. The tower at Isely AFB was operated by a small detachment from the 1958th AACS Squadron. It is not known whether this unit remained on Saipan after inactivation of the field.
