1. Purpose. This notice promulgates for the information of the addressees, the Agreement under which the transfer of administrative responsibility for the Saipan District of the Pacific Islands from the Secretary of the Interior to the Secretary of the Navy was effected.

2. Objective. Pursuant to references (d) and (e) the Department of the Navy and the Department of the Interior have drawn up an agreement covering the transfer of administrative responsibility for the Saipan District. The transfer agreement, enclosure (1), has been approved by the Secretary of the Navy, references (a) and (c) and the Secretary of the Interior, reference (b). The interdepartmental agreement enclosed herewith describes the mechanics of the transfer of administrative responsibility to the Department of the Navy and outlines the future relationship between the Department of the Navy and the Department of Interior with respect to the Saipan District of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.

3. Effective Date. In accordance with reference (d) the transfer of Saipan and Tinian Islands was effected 1 January 1953. By reference (e) the transfer of the remaining Mariana Islands less Rota became effective on 17 July 1953.

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4. Cancellation. This notice may be retained for reference purposes, or cancelled when no longer needed.

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AGREEMENT BETWEEN

OF THE TRUST TERRITORY OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS

The President of the United States by Executive Order 10265 executed on June 29, 1951 directed that the administration of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, hereinafter referred to as "Trust Territory", be transferred from the Secretary of the Navy to the Secretary of the Interior, effective July 1, 1951. The President of the United States has now, by Executive Order 10408 executed on November 10, 1952, ordered that the administration of that portion of the Trust Territory which includes the islands of Tinian and Saipan be transferred from the Secretary of the Interior to the Secretary of the Navy, effective January 1, 1953 and further, has by Executive Order 10470 executed on July 17, 1953 amended Executive Order No. 10408 of November 10, 1952, transferring the administration of that portion of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands which includes the islands of Tinian and Saipan from the Secretary of the Interior to the Secretary of the Navy, to provide that that portion of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands over which administration is transferred from the Secretary of the Interior to the Secretary of the Navy shall include all of the Northern Mariana Islands of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands except the Island of Rota.

For the purposes of this Agreement, that portion of the Trust Territory to be administered by the Department of the Navy under Executive Order 10408 as amended by Executive Order 10470 will be that area known as the Saipan District which consists of those islands of the Trust Territory of the Pacific

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Islands and the Territorial waters thereof, which lie north of 14-20 degrees north latitude, and west of 150 degrees east longitude. Thirteen island units, and several reefs, comprise the exposed portion of the Saipan District. It extends in a slight crescent from Uracas (Farrallon de Pajaros) in the north to south of Aguijan - a distance of about 530 miles. There are a total of 18 separate islands having a total land area of 121.118 square miles in the group. These islands are: Uracas or Farrallon de Pajaros (1), Maug (3), Asuncion (1), Agrihan (1), Pagan (1), Alamagan (1), Guguan (1), Sarigan (1), Anatahan (1), Farrallon de Medinilla (1), Saipan (3), Tinian (1), Aguijan (2).

Conditions of the Agreement heretofore executed by the Department of the Navy and the Department of the Interior with respect to the transfer of responsibility for the administration of the Government of the Trust Territory, under Executive Order 10265, hereinafter referred to as the "Original Transfer Agreement", shall remain in full force and effect after January 1, 1953, except that insofar as such conditions are applicable to the Saipan District, they shall be of no further force and effect.

The administrative responsibility of the Saipan District will be exercised by the Secretary of the Navy through the normal chain of administrative command, namely, Chief of Naval Operations, Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet, Commander Naval Forces Marianas and the Civil Administrator of the Saipan District.

Except as may be otherwise provided in this Agreement or any other agreement between the two Departments, it is agreed that the administration of the Saipan District by the Department of the Navy shall become independent of the administration of the balance of the Trust Territory by the Department of the Interior

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The administrative responsibility of the Saipan District will be exercised by the Secretary of the Navy through the normal chain of administrative command, namely, Chief of Naval Operations, Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet, Commander Naval Forces Marianas and the Civil Administrator of the Saipan District.

Except as may be otherwise provided in this Agreement or any other agreement between the two Departments, it is agreed that the administration of the Saipan District by the Department of the Navy shall become independent of the administration of the balance of the Trust Territory by the Department of the Interior

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as soon as practicable following the date of transfer.

The Department of the Navy and the Department of the Interior will endeavor to coordinate their various programs including but not limited to those affecting economics, agriculture, public health, education and legislation. HICOMTERPACIS and CINCPACFLT are authorized to deal directly with each other in effecting such coordination. The Department of the Navy and the Department of the Interior will be kept appropriately informed.

It is further agreed as follows:

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ARTICLE 1

LOGISTICS

Section A - General

1. The Department of the Navy will assume responsibility for logistic support of the Saipan District on the date of transfer. Logistic support will be provided by the Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet through normal channels. COMNAV Marianas will be the Naval Force Commander responsible to Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet for logistic support of the Saipan District.
2. Entry for vessels and aircraft owned by the United States and under the custody of the Department of the Interior will be granted by the Department of the Navy after January 1, 1953 to the Saipan District for the purpose of lifting stockpiled cargo and personnel and for such other purposes as may be mutually agreed upon by CINCPACFLT and HICOMPACIS.
3. All services being rendered by the Island Trading Company to the Saipan District will be terminated on or before the date of transfer.
4. The Navy Department will assume responsibility on the date of transfer for logistic support and services in the Saipan District to other Government Agencies and third parties in accordance with existing arrangements.
5. Certain students, whose residence is in the Saipan District, are now assigned and maintained in educational pursuits outside the Saipan District namely: Suva, Truk and Hawaii. The Department of the Navy assumes responsibility for reimbursing the Government of the Trust Territory for the costs it incurs in the educational programs of these students and the Department

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of the Navy intends that their studies be continued until termination of the courses of study now planned,

ARTICLE 1

LOGISTICS

Section B - Personal Property

1. To the extent authorized by law, title to all personal property located in the Saipan District which is owned by the Government of the Trust Territory or under the control of the Department of the Interior and employed by the Government of the Trust Territory in the administration of civil affairs of the Saipan District, will be transferred to the Department of the Navy or the Naval Government of the Saipan District on a non-reimbursable basis except POL and resale commissary supplies which will be transferred on a reimbursable basis.

a. All types of property will be listed on separate schedules with estimated current and book values to the extent deemed necessary.

b. The aforementioned schedules with authorized signatures affixed will constitute the official record of property and/or material transferred to the Department of the Navy or its designated representatives.

2. RESALE commissary store supplies will be offered to the Department of the Navy at book value. To save the Department of the Interior the expense of shipping to another portion of the Trust Territory, the Department of the Navy will attempt to make the maximum utilization of these stocks consistent with the needs of the Department of the Navy and its obligations to the commissary store patrons.

3. It is recognized that the Government of the Trust Territory has used the Saipan District for the stockpiling of supplies for the use of the entire

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Trust Territory. Not later than July 1, 1953, the Department of the Interior will remove those supplies intended for use outside the Saipan District and any other supplies surplus to the needs of the Civil Government of the Saipan District. It is understood, however, that consumable supplies for the Saipan District sufficient for a period of approximately three months following January 1, 1953, will not be removed.

4. Shipping charges on supplies and equipment for use within the Saipan District on order but undelivered on 1 January 1953, shall be for the account of the Naval Government.

5. Effective on the date of transfer, the Navy Department will assume the authority and responsibility of the Government of the Trust Territory with respect to all contracts which relate wholly to property located in the Saipan District including contracts for the disposal of residual and abandoned surplus property. With respect to contracts relating to property both within and outside the Saipan District, the Department of the Navy will assume the authority and responsibility of the Government of the Trust Territory in the administration of the contracts insofar as the contracts relate to property located within the Saipan District, provided that no action will be taken by the Navy Department or the Government of the Trust Territory which could be grounds for termination of such contracts or any part thereof unless previously agreed upon by the High Commissioner and CinCPacFlt.

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ARTICLE 1

LOGISTICS

Section C - Real Property

1. Buildings, improvements, facilities and land under the custody of the Government of the Trust Territory, or Department of the Interior, will be transferred to the custody of the Department of the Navy. It is understood that settlement of land claims in the Saipan District is the responsibility of the Department of the Navy. The Department of the Interior hereby releases the Department of the Navy from any obligation to compensate it and the Government of the Trust Territory for the use, occupancy, retention or destruction of land in the Saipan District, as provided in the terms of the Original Transfer Agreement.
2. All buildings, improvements, facilities and land not included in paragraph 1, which are used for civil administration by the Government of the Trust Territory, will be placed in the custody of the Department of the Navy.
3. It is recognized that the Department of the Navy has retained administrative authority over certain areas in the Saipan District as defined in COMNAVMARIANAS letter serial 00135 of 1 November 1951. The facilities located in these areas, that are required and used in conjunction with the present civil administration will be operated by the Department of the Navy after the date of transfer.

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ARTICLE 1

LOGISTICS

Section D - Surface Transportation

1. Surface Transportation for the Saipan District will become a responsibility of the Department of the Navy on and after the date of transfer and will be provided by CINCPACFLT through normal channels. COMNAVMARIANAS will be the Naval Force Commander responsible for provision of surface transportation. COMSERVPAC will provide support as appropriate.
2. The small craft listed in Annex B, will be returned to the Department of the Navy by the Department of the Interior. It is understood that the small craft listed in Annex B were originally transferred by the Department of the Navy to the Department of the Interior pursuant to the terms of the Original Transfer Agreement.
3. The Department of the Navy will assume no responsibility in connection with administration of the contract or operations of the Pacific Micronesian Line.

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ARTICLE 1

LOGISTICS

Section E - Air Transportation

1. Air Transportation for the Saipan District will be a responsibility of the Department of the Navy and will be provided by CINCPACFLT through normal channels. COMNAVMARIANAS will be the Naval Force Commander responsible for provision of air transportation.
2. The Department of the Navy will assume no responsibility in connection with operations of the Trans-Ocean Air Lines or administration of the contract between Trans-Ocean Air Lines and the Government of the Trust Territory.

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ARTICLE 1

LOGISTICS

Section F - Finance

1. On the basis of advice from the Bureau of the Budget it is understood that there will be no adjustment of appropriated funds between the two departments without its approval. The proceeds of the head tax and any other annual tax levy in the Saipan District will be apportioned equally between the Navy Department and the Government of the Trust Territory. With respect to all other items of revenues in the Saipan District those which are due and uncollected prior to January 1, 1953 as collected by the Navy Department will be turned over to the Government of the Trust Territory. Property located within the Saipan District including cattle which was purchased with money from the economic development and Conservation Fund will remain in the Saipan District. In view of the large amount already contributed by the Fund for cattle in the Saipan District and since the Fund was built up from sources entirely outside the Saipan District, it is understood there will be no further expenditure from the Fund in the Saipan District.
2. The Department of the Interior will furnish the Department of the Navy with statements covering all fiscal and accounting records pertaining to and located in the Saipan District including statements of all local revenue either collected or owing. The latter will cover the six months period immediately prior to January 1, 1953.
3. The Naval Supply Depot, Guam will perform fiscal and accounting functions for the administration of the Saipan District.

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ARTICLE 2

COMMUNICATIONS

1. The Department of the Navy will:

a. Assume full responsibility for administration, operation and maintenance of all communication facilities in the Saipan District, effective on the date of transfer.

b. Provide through Navy Communication Channels, on a non-reimbursable basis, such radio communication services as may be required between the Trust Territory Government and the Saipan District to the extent permitted by current Naval Directives.

2. The Department of the Interior will:

a. Transfer on a non-reimbursable basis to the Department of the Navy electronic equipment and associated spare parts and material listed in Annex C, required for the operation of radio stations in the Saipan District. It is understood that all property listed in Annex C was originally transferred by the Department of the Navy to the Department of the Interior pursuant to the terms of the Original Transfer Agreement.

3. The Department of the Navy may continue to use the frequencies and/or call signs presently assigned to Trust Territory Government radio communication stations in the Saipan District until otherwise agreed by representatives of the Department of the Navy and the Department of the Interior in the Interdepartment Radio Advisory Committee (IRAC).

4. The Department of the Navy will assume licensing authority for amateur radio operations in the Saipan District. Amateur radio call sign block

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KG6SA through KG6SZ (Saipan) and KG6TA through KG6TZ (Mariana Islands other than Saipan and Guam) will accordingly be released by the Department of the Interior.

ARTICLE 3

DISPOSITION OF FILES AND RECORDS

1. It is recognized that the Department of the Navy should have access to all existing files, both correspondence and dispatches, necessary for the administration of the Saipan District.
2. Files were turned over to HICOMTERPACIS prior to 1 July 1951, dated back, in some instances, to 1944. However, as CNO directed that all documents of historical value be microfilmed, a permanent record of this old correspondence is on file with the Navy. Therefore, it is considered that only those files relating exclusively to the Saipan District that were turned over to the Department of the Interior by the Navy at HICOMTERPACIS headquarters and those which have accumulated at Saipan headquarters pertaining to Saipan District between 1 July 1951 and 1 January 1953 need be turned over to the Department of the Navy and shall be receipted for individually.
 - a. Classified matter up to and including confidential will be turned over to the Department of the Navy without individual receipts.
 - b. Secret or Top Secret matter still in effect, that was turned over to the Department of the Interior in connection with the Civil Administration of the Saipan District, will be returned to the Department of the Navy and shall be receipted for individually.
3. The records of the Saipan District - legal, administrative, clerical, etc., affecting the Saipan District or any element of it - which are in the Saipan District will remain in the Saipan District.

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ARTICLE 4

SEARCH AND RESCUE RESPONSIBILITY

1. Subsequent to the date of transfer, the Search and Rescue responsibility in the Saipan District will continue to be the responsibility of the appropriate naval command as currently assigned.

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ARTICLE 5

MESSES, CLUBS AND RECREATION FACILITIES

1. All messes, clubs and recreation facilities, together with the equipment and furnishings which have been purchased with grant funds, or non-appropriated funds, will be transferred to the Department of the Navy in the same manner as other government property.
2. The governing body of each mess, club or recreational facility shall determine the disposition to be made of material and supplies purchased with non-appropriated funds. When the governing body so determines such material or supplies may be offered for purchase to such clubs, messes or recreational facilities as may be authorized. When so offered the material shall be listed separately, together with a sale price and a description of its condition.
3. Material and supplies purchased from non-appropriated funds not requested by the Department of the Navy or an authorized club or mess will be disposed of by the owner.

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ARTICLE 6

PERSONNEL

1. The Department of the Navy will assume responsibility for administration of all personnel employed in connection with the Civil Administration of the Saipan District effective on the date of transfer.
2. It is the present intention of the Department of the Navy to continue employment of only necessary indigenous and non-indigenous civilian personnel. Services of those not required will be terminated by normal administrative procedures as soon as practicable until the allowance is within that prescribed by the Secretary of the Navy.
3. The High Commissioner of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands and the Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet are authorized to deal directly with each other in connection with the turnover of personnel incidental to the change in administration.
4. It is contemplated that the following personnel of the Government of the Trust Territory will be transferred to Navy Department rolls on 1 January 1953:

It is contemplated that the following personnel of the Government of the Trust Territory will be transferred to other districts on 1 January 1953, but may be reassigned to the Saipan District on a temporary duty status at the request of the Department of the Navy on a reimbursable basis until relieved by Navy

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Department personnel, which it is understood will not be later than 1 April 1953:

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5. The Special Construction Staff and other inter-district civilian personnel now based on Saipan are on the Headquarters rolls of HICOMTERPACIS and will be so continued. They will not be available for transfer to Navy rolls. Such personnel will be evacuated from Saipan as soon as practicable.

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ARTICLE 7

LAW, LEGISLATION AND JUDICIARY

1. The effective Executive Orders and Proclamations of the High Commissioner; Interim Regulations of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands; the supplemental regulations and orders issued thereunder; all judicial judgments and decrees; and all final determinations of Title Officers acting pursuant to Land and Claims Regulation No. 1, which have been promulgated or entered prior to 1 January 1953, shall have full force and effect in the Saipan District on and after 1 January 1953. Wherever an official, employee, or other person is named or described in the foregoing orders, proclamations and regulations, the term will be construed as referring to his successor appointed or continued under the administration of the Department of the Navy. The judges, officers and employees of the Saipan District Court and other inferior courts of the district will continue in office as if no transfer of administration had taken place, but subject to such changes in tenure, jurisdiction, etc., as may be prescribed in the future. The jurisdiction of the High Court of the Trust Territory will terminate with respect to the Saipan District as of midnight 31 December 1952. The judicial power which the High Court exercised in the Saipan District will be exercised by a court known as the Saipan Court of Appeals, the justices and judges of which shall be appointed by (COMNAV Marianas). All cases pending in the High Court on December 31, 1952 will be considered on and after January 1, 1953, to have been filed with the Saipan Court of Appeals.

2. After January 1, 1953, when it is desirable to promulgate laws and regulations applicable to the entire Trust Territory such laws and regulations will

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be jointly promulgated by the duly authorized representatives of the Department of the Interior and the Department of the Navy.

After January 1, 1953, when it is desirable to promulgate laws and regulations applicable only to either that portion of the Trust Territory under the administration of the Department of the Interior or the Department of the Navy then the duly authorized representatives of these Departments may promulgate laws and regulations applicable only in that portion of the Trust Territory for which their respective Departments are administratively responsible. Each Department will keep the other currently informed of the promulgation of all laws and regulations for their respective jurisdictions. The two Departments recognize that it would be advantageous to preserve the uniformity of law throughout the Trust Territory. The Navy Department will undertake to promulgate for the Saipan District laws in consonance with those for the rest of the Trust Territory as practicable.

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ARTICLE 8

OPERATION OF POST OFFICES

1. For purposes of security a Navy Post Office will be established at Saipan after 1 January 1953. This post office will be staffed by Navy personnel and a Navy number will be assigned as mailing address. Incoming and outgoing military mail and mail that will be handled for other departments or branches of the U. S. Government in the Saipan District will be cleared through this Navy Post Office. The address will be Naval Administration Unit, Navy #935, Fleet Post Office, San Francisco, California.
2. The Department of the Navy will make arrangements to continue the operation of the present U. S. Post Office for the principal benefit of the indigenous personnel living in the district.

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ARTICLE 9

WEATHER SERVICES

1. There are no weather stations operated by Weather Bureau personnel, in the Saipan District. No transfer of equipment or personnel involved.

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ARTICLE 10

MEDICAL

1. (a) The Department of the Navy will assume responsibility for all medical functions in the Saipan District effective on the date of transfer to include:

- a. Medical Care and Hospitalization of all persons.
- b. Public Health and sanitation programs.

(b) The Department of the Navy will assume responsibility for the operation of the Leprosarium on Tinian and care of insane persons on Saipan effective on the date of transfer. Patients committed by the High Commissioner shall be accepted for treatment and care at these institutions on a reimbursable basis. It is agreed that at the earliest practicable date the Department of the Interior will request appropriations for the reestablishment of appropriate facilities for the care of leprous patients and insane persons at another location outside the Saipan District not later than 30 June 1954. These facilities when established will be made available to the residents of the Saipan District on a reimbursable basis.

2. To insure the availability of uninterrupted health, sanitary and medical services in the Saipan District, after the date of transfer the Department of the Interior will endeavor to provide medical personnel on a reimbursable basis, until adequate reliefs are furnished by the Department of the Navy not later than 1 April 1953.

3. Medical Supplies and Equipment, and supplies and equipment used in conjunction with sanitation and health programs of the Saipan District now in

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custody of the Government of the Trust Territory, will be transferred in the same manner as other government property.

4. (a) Reimbursement rates for in-patient service at the Leprosarium and Mental Hospital shall be established on a cost per patient per day figure mutually agreed upon by the Secretary of the Navy and the Secretary of the Interior.
