### UNITED NATIONS' FIELD DAY REPORT

### UNITED NATIONS FIELD DAY BULLETIN OCTOBER 18, 1954

On Friday, October 15, 1954, a meeting of the U. N. Field Day General committee was held. This bulletin contains a resume of the reports of the chairmen.

### I. Athletic Committee

- 1. All names of participants in athletic events with the exception of those from Tuturam, San Roque, and the Dependents School have been submitted.
- 2. Miss Dolores Tenorio and Miss Abelina Sablan are taking care of plans for the games for the elementary school children.
- 3. Plans have been made to prepare the field. Felix Rabauliman is assuming responsibility for lining the field, and Jose Taitano is going to take care of the construction of the broad jump and high jump pits.
- 4. Plans are complete for the boxing events, and Nick Palacios is making plans for a ring. He has requested that Donicio Torres bring a group of his students over from the Intermediate School to remodel the band stand in order that it may be used as a ring.
- 5. Mrs. Martin stated that all prizes had been counted and that there are a sufficient number to be awarded to winners in all events. The prizes will be awarded immediately after each event.
- 6. It was suggested that following the arrival of the parade at the Chalan Kanoa athletic field and after the speeches the children will disband and return to their parents with the exception of those participating in athletic events.
- 7. Father Canice has not as yet been contacted to request that he umpire the baseball game.

### II. Advertising Committee:

- 1. The Advertising Committee has completed a major part of its work.
- 2. The following persons will be requested to act as judges in the poster contest: Mrs. Morman, Mrs. Law, and Father Canice.
- 3. It was suggested during the course of the meeting that the Advertising Committee develop printed and singing commercials to encourage the sale of hot dogs and soft drinks.
- 4. Mr. Harshbarger has requested that all posters and related information be saved so that it may be forwarded with the Quarterly Report.

### III. Concession Committee

- 1. Arrangements have been made for the purchase of hot dogs on Guam. It is anticipated that they will reach Saipan on Wednesday. Mrs. Stafford has agreed to pick them up.
- 2. Mr. Tenorio has made arrangements with Mr. Herman Guerrero to bake 1,000 hot dog buns.
- 3. Mr. Torres has been requested to aid in the construction of two concession stands.

- 4. Mr. Tenorio is making arrangements to borrow a 16 MM projector from Father Canice and film from Mr. Herman Guerrero.
- 5. It was suggested that in the event hot dogs, buns, etc., are left over that they be offered for sale to the members of the Saipan District Teachers Organization.

### IV. Parade Committee

- 1. It was suggested that to insure good organization at the assembly point a parade master be selected. It was further suggested that Mr. Manuel Aldan be requested to accept that position.
- 2. The Parade Committee will meet Monday to determine the exact parade formation. A mimeographed plan will be issued following this meeting, and distributed to all teachers, float contributors, bull cart owners, etc.
- 3. Mr. Reyes has agreed to furnish lanyards for the athletic field flag posts, and Mr. Jesus Guerrero will provide the U. N. and U. S. flags.
- 4. The Island Constabulary will supply a color guard with buglers.
- 5. Father Arnold has indicated that the Parochial School will provide a float.
- 6. The bull cart riders will be notified of their selection on Friday. The owners of the bull carts are going to decorate them, and they will also provide escorts.
- 7. Mr. Reyes has agreed to direct the vocal music while the parade is enroute from the Church to the Chalan Kanoa athletic field.
- 8. Mr. Harshbarger will contact the band leader concerning the procedures to be followed during the parade.
- 9. The following persons are to be requested to act as judges of the floats and bull carts: Commander Law, Mrs. Gunter, and Mayor Benavente.
- 10. Miss Merced Sablan will write letters to Commander Law and Mayor Benavente requesting that they present speeches commenorating the occasion of United Nations Day.





# U.N. DAY ADDRESS OF CDR. ROBERT D. LAW, Jr. U.S. Nevel Administrator Seipan District, Mariane Islands

Mayor Benavents, Honored Guests, Friends

It gives me a great deal of pleasure to be here with you on the occasion of this United Nations Day 1954.

A great deal has been written and even more has been said about what the United Nations Organization means to you and to me and to our friends and to our neighbors.

You are all aware of the fact that the duties of the United Nations organization are quite varied and cover many fields. These responsibilities range from the fighting of a police action in Kores to the care of little children all over the world.

We do not have time here this morning to discuss all the espects of what the United Nations stands for.

I would, however, like to touch upon the aspect that most concerns you and me.

Under the United Nations the United States of America has been given the responsibility of administering this section of the world known as the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands. As you all know in the Saipan District this task has been delegated to the United States Navy.

Let us then take a look at what this means when it comes down to such everyday terms as you and me.

On my part, as the representative of the administering authority I have many duties. All of these duties have to do with making Saipan and the rest of the Saipan District a better place to live for you and your families. To this end we have set up programs to advance the education, the health, the welfare, the economic condition and the overall way of life of the Saipanese.

Daily we work with you people in an attempt to reach these goals.

On your part you have assumed the responsibility of establishing your community as one to be recognized and respected in this world community that is called the United Nations. This task that you have assumed is a large one indeed. In order to achieve the success that you want and deserve, each of you has a large individual responsibility.

You must, each of you, every day and in every way do everything possible toward reaching these goals:

You may ask how you, the individual, may contribute to this cause. The answer to this question is an easy one but it is, at the same time, a broad one.

You must actively participate in your community affairs. You must take an in erest in your school programs and the education of yourself and your children. You must learn to believe in and support the sanitation program that is being carried on for your benefit. You must do your best to carry out the policies set up by your own Saipanese Legislature and Government. To sum it up you must all become good citizens of Shipan.

If each of us can, in our own way become a good citizen of our community it then follows naturally that our own community will be a good one. If we can get all of our communities to be good ones we can then hope to band these communities together and achieve the aspirations and goals that the United Nations really stands for.

That is our job. It belongs to each of us. On this United Nations day let us each dedicate ourselves to do our own part to reach the desired goal.

# U.N. DAY ADDRESS OF IGNACIO V., BENAVENTE CHIEF COMMISSIONER SAIPAN DISTRICT

Cdr. Law, Honorable guests, Ladies and Gentlemen:

It is with great pleasure that I comply with the wishes of the committees of this celebration, to say a few words to the assembly this morning.

On this occasion I would like to recall to our memory the most important purposes of the United Nations organization.

The United Nations came into existence on October 24, 1945. This means that to-day is the minth anniversary of the complete ratification of the U. N. Charter by the United Nations members. There are 60 Member Nations in the U.N. organization, which has the United States of America as its leading member.

The purposes of the United Nations are:

- To meintain international peace and security.
- 2. To develop friendly relations among nations.
- 3. To achieve international cooperation in solving international problems of an economic, social, and cultural character, and in promoting and encouraging respect for human rights and for fundamental freedoms for all without distinction as to race, language or religion.

One of the basic objectives of the trusteeship system in the United Netions is to promote our political, economic, social, and educational advancement in the Northern Marlanas as well as those of the inhabitants of other islands in this and in the other Trust Tarritories; and also to promote our progressive development towards selfgovernment as may be appropriate to cur political circumstances and our freely expressed wishes.

It is, therefore, the moral obligation for us citizens of the Trust territory to realize and to appreciate these favorable and friendly purposes and intentions of the United Nations towards us; and it is appropriate and just for us to commemorate and to honor United Nations Days, as we do to-day, as a manifestation of our deep appreciation.

Whehave seen evidences of the earnest concern of the U.N. for our welfare as a visiting committee visited in Saipen in April 1950; and enother committee came to Saipen and Tinian at the end of February last year. The individuals of those committees are being represented, as you can see, on one of the floats taking part in the parade. The intentions of their visits in Saipen and Tinian were not of sightseeings but of investigating whether our Administering authority is exercising its administration in consonance with the terms of the Trusteeship Agreement and also to listen to whatsoever problems and petitions our representatives may present to them.

We are very fortunate, however, in that we have the U. S. A. as our administering Authority under which administration we are enjoying freedom of religion, and different powers are not completely enjoying. It is undeniable that our Administering Authority is making every effort in our behalf. Never before did we have a greater degree of helath, opportunities for higher education, prosperity, and enjoyment of life, as we do have now. These all come through our American Administering Authority.

our friendliness and kindliness to the Administering Authority and also our faithful and unfailing cooperation and understanding in beliging the Administering Authority to earry out its work in these Islands. I ungently ask every citizen of Saipan to follow Cdr. Law's very essential advise, that we must strive to become good citizens of Saipan by actively participating in our community affairs. Let us work together in order that we may attain to a higher standard of health and the standard of education we need for our salfgovernment, and also to selfsufficiency. And for the United Nations let us daily pray to God that they may attain to their very important objective which is "To maintain international peace and security" for many years to come.
