My dear Mr. Uyayan:

In accordance with the request in your letter of 2 May, Vice Consul
George and Luis D. Misa accompanied by investigator to Saipan and
were in attendance at the inquiry. As your representative has prob-
ably informed you, Misa's allegations were not wholly supported by
the evidence presented during the investigation.

The arrest and detention of Mr. Misa was found to be both legal and in
keeping with the circumstances concomitant to his arrest. In addition,
insufficient evidence was available to support a charge of maltreatment
by the Insular Constabulary.

I appreciate your bringing the incident to my attention in order that
the circumstances could be investigated.
