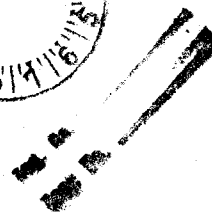
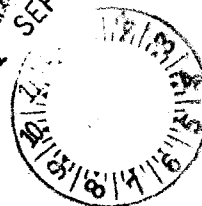

IMMEDIATE RELEASE

The Guam Legislature has received information from the Honorable J. R. Cruz, Legislative Secretary for the Twelfth Saipan Legislature and Chairman, Committee on the Marianas Reintegration that Resolution No. 4, "Relative to the reopening of the unfinished Resolution No. 10, for the reintegration and the unification of the Marianas Islands", has been introduced for adoption by the Saipan Legislature. Besides the endorsement by the Legislators, the various civic leaders also signed the Resolution: I. V. Benavente, Mayor; I. S. Tuledad, Commissioner; M. M. Aquino, Commissioner; and J. A. Shimiza, Citizen.

The committee on the Marianas Reintegration met (sic) on July 23, 1959, and acted most favorably on the resolution relative to the Marianas Unification. The Committee on its report to the Speaker of the Legislature states:

"That said Resolution No. 10, by the Eleventh Saipan Legislature is now most proper and indispensable for adoption, since this matter has already been investigated by the past legislature, and that public wish and opinions were demonstrated by the attached report exhibit "A".

The Honorable Cruz is here on Guam on a brief visit and will be returning to Saipan Tuesday morning.
