#### 1. Forwarded.

The following comments and recommendations regarding enclosures (1), (2), (3) and (4) are berevith submitted:

### a. Resolution No. 8

(1) Commander Naval Forces Marianas concurs with the Naval Administrator, Saipan, that the question of integration will continue to be discussed and that resolutions regarding this subject will continue to be adopted by the Saipan Legislature. It is believed, however, that the committee which was appointed by the Saipan Legislature to make a study of integration continue to function and more fully explore all aspects of the problem.

#### b. Resolution No. 9

(1) Commander Naval Forces Marianas concurs with the comments made by the Maval Administrator.

#### Resolution Mo. 10

(1) Commander Waval Forces Marianas questions the advisability of granting a pay increase. With current budgetary limitations, it is doubtful that additional funds could be obtained to meet any pay increase and if granted, would produce more unemployment on the island.

#### d. Resolution No. 11

(1) Local Imaigration Officials advise they have no knowledge of any restrictions which would prohibit Saipanese from entering Guam for the purpose of employment with firms having Defense Contracts or Defense Department Agencies. However, it is doubtful that bringing Saipanese into Guam as contract labor would solve the economic problems of the

a stop-gap measure as it is doubtful that the importation of alien labor into Guam will continue indefinitely. It is recommended that the Naval Administrator more vigorously pursue the agriculture, copra and cattle programs as a means of solving the economic problems of the district.

## 3. General Comments

a. It has been generally observed that in recent months there has been less and less contact between the Maval Administrator, his staff and the local legislature. This lack of contact has produced a situation whereby the local legislators have expressed a lack of confidence in the present administration, which has resulted in a number of resolutions being passed. It is believed that had the administration been available for consultation and advice, some of the problems could have been resolved without resulting in a passage of resolutions. It is recommended that in the future a closer limits between the administration, the legislature and the various committees of the legislature be established in order that the local people may have the benefit of the knowledge and experience of our personnel.


