The conflicting viexa of the state Department and the Joint Chiefs of Staff with respect to Japanese and Japanese Mandated Lilands have been referred to an Ad Hoc Comittee composed of representatives of the State, War, and Mavy Departments.

It is not oxpected that the Ad hoc Comittee vill nake Lte report to the State-Nar-Navy Coordinating Comittee prior to 1 August.

As soon as the hd Hoc Comittee has reported, the State-War-Mavy Coordinatine Comaltteo will subait a report which will be promptly formarded to the President by the State Departirent. It is very unlikely that this report will reach the President prior to 5 August and it may be as late ae 10 or 15 August.

I understand that the President is intorested in resolving the conflicting views of the three Departinents before the Ceneral Assembly of the United Wations convertese in Nem York in September, I belleve that we vill heve the combined viewo of the three Departmente at least a month before the Assambly corvenes and that, should the Presicent inquire, you can Inform him that you will moke your report to hin well before the United Mations Septenber deadine.

For your Informetion, the state-War-Nayy Coordinating Conmittee is composed of lloward Petersen, Assistant Secretary of War, John Sullivan, Under Secretary of the Navy, and James C. Dinn, Assistant Secretary of State. Mr. Dunn has just been nominated as Anbessador to Italy and his successor on the Comittee has not yet been named.

The nembers of the State-Mar-Mavy Coordinating Conittee Secretarlat are Mr. R. E. Cox for War, Commodore B. L. Austin for Navy and Mr. Mlexander neld for State.
