His Selection for U. N. Post: Is Sent to Senate With List of Recess Nominations

dent Truman sent to the Senate today a long list of nominations. Some were new, and the others formalized appointments he had announced during the congressional recess.

There was no immediate evidence of opposition to the leading: nominees. A spokesman at the Republican National Headquarters said that he had not heard of moves to block any of the names which had come to his attention.

A new appointment was that of Francis B. Sayre of this city as United States representative on the United Nations Trustceship Council. Mr. Sayre, a lawyer and former professor, has been active in diplomacy for more than twenty years.

He is a former assistant Secretary of State and formerly served as High Commissioner of the Philippines. His most recent post has been that of diplomatic adviser to the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration.
