This is to acknewledge and to thank you for your letter to the Fresident transmitting the resolution of the denoral Assoably of American Equips and also for your letter summarising your views concorning the plans for the administration of Guam, American Samea, and the Trust Territory.

By direction of the Freeldont, I requested representatives of the Secretarias of State, Army, Mavy and Inturior to consider the petition and other factors which sight require reconsideration of the President's program as outlined in his communication of June 19, 1967, to the Congress and his letters of February 11, 1943, to the Dopartments concorned. This program was besed on the unanimous recommendations of the Secretaries of State, Army, Mavy and Interior.

It was unanimously agreed that no change should be nade in the Propident's program. It was further responsended that organic legislation should be submitted to the Congress at this section. This would apply to Aserican Samon and the Truck Territory only, as logislation with respect to Guam was subalited at the last essaion.

it was further suggested that, since action is improbable at this session, Congress should be urged to pass the pending concurrent resolution providing for Congressional study of the needs of the lelands and their administration. This abould be done immediately after the proposed legislation has been submitted, thus looking toward the enactment of appropriate organic legislation at the post secolor.

The above resourcedations appear to constitute a sound program. I understand that the proposed organic legislation for American Samon is now being expedited in your Department for immediate elearance with the Survey of the Sudget.
