To the Peace Corps Volunteers in Micronesia:

Prior to the publication of this 1973 comprehensive 'mug book," separate picture/biography booklets were produced for each large Peace Corps/Micronesia training program. Many Volunteers in small or individual training programs were not included in any booklets. This meant, that at any given time, it was necessary to have a collection of three or four mug books in order to identify all of the Peace Corps Volunteers in Micronesia (including new Volunteers, mid-service Volunteers, and extendee Volunteers) and, even then, several were missing.

The purpose of this year book approach is to include and identify every Peace Corps Volunteer in Micronesia as of September 1, 1973, in one volume. Also included are candid pictures of Peace Corps staff members, Volunteers, and training activities.



SIMON, Lois J. (6-2-06 1232 Circle Drive Baltimore, Maryland 21227 I.D. 325368 — COS 6/30/74


