1964 U.N. VISITING MISSION

SAIPAN, M. I....A United Nations Visiting Mission is due to arrive Saipan on February 10 from Honolulu to begin a month's inspection tour of the Trust Territory islands, which are administered by the United States under a trusteeship agreement with the United Nations. This will be the sixth Visiting Mission to make such an inspection tour, others having toured the Territory in 1951, 1953, 1956, 1959, and 1961.

The Mission will be headed by Trusteeship Council vice-president, Mr. Frank H. Corner of New Zealand. Other members of the Mission include Mr. Cecil E. King of the United Kingdom, Mr. Chiping H. C. Kiang of China, and Miss Angie Brooks of Liberia--all members of the Trusteeship Council. Four members of the U.N. Secretariat will be accompanying the Visiting Mission during its four-week tour of the Territory to study economic, political and social advancement. They are Mr. Hung-Ti Chu, principal secretary, Mr. George T. Daniel, political affairs officer; Mr. William N. Shane, administrative and finance officer; and Miss Dorothea Sylvester,

secretary. T.T. Program Officer John E. deYoung will accompany the U.N. Mission as Trust Territory Administration's representative.

According to the present itinerary, the Mission is expected to conclude its investigative tour of the Territory on or about March 10, 1964.

The Visiting Mission will transit Guam on several occasions, the first being the morning of February 10 on its arrival from Honolulu. Visit will be made on February 10 to the College of Guam.
