SUBJECT: Application of SANITIZED

On March 16th we received a report on Mr. SANITIZED personal interview and were able to send his complete application materials to the Overseas Operations Program and the Graduate School office for evaluation. Yesterday the materials came back to us.

Mr. SANITIZED was judged unacceptable by the teaching department and his request for admission was denied by the Graduate School. His undergraduate performance, coupled with his very low score on the Miller Analogies test, led to the conclusion that he was not a qualified candidate. Note was also made of his apparent inability to complete independent work assigned to him (senior thesis "D") and the absence of appropriately strong recommendations or compensating experience.

A letter is now being prepared, informing Mr. SANITIZED that he was not selected for a grant.
