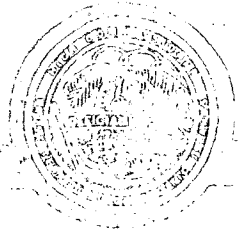

HIGH COMMISSIONER PRESENTS INCENTIVE AWARDS

SAIPAN, M.I. (August 20)...Three Sustained Superior Performance Awards and two Special Awards were made by High Commissioner M. W. Goding this month to Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands employees. Both types of awards come under the Trust Territory Government's Incentive Awards program which is established to individually recognize, among other things, the superior performance of employees at all levels. Sustained Superior Performance awards are given to persons who do outstanding work in line with their jobs, while Special Awards are for acts performed by Government employees which fall outside of the normal duties of their position.

In a ceremony on August 18, High Commissioner Goding personally presented a Sustained Superior Performance Award to Ernesta Pangelinan, Saipan, Secretary to the Headquarters Transportation Officer. Mr. Goding commended Miss Pangelinan for the productivity, neatness and quality of her work and her ability to compile and maintain current transportation statistics.

The other awards went to three persons in Ponape District and one in Yap District. "I regret that I cannot make each award personally," said Mr. Goding, "These persons are a credit to our administration."

Antonio Materne received a Sustained Superior Performance Award for his performance as Administrative Clerk in the Ponape District Administration, during the period June 28 through October 2, 1961. During that time, he assumed the duties of the Administrative Assistant in addition to his regular position and handled all phases of the additional duties in a manner far exceeding the normal requirements of his position.

Kulian Daitat received a Sustained Superior Performance Award for his 16 years of outstanding service as a Health Aide in Ponape Hospital.

David Hadley, Ponape, received a Special Award for his quick action in saving a child from possible electrocution on high voltage wires on September 30, 1961.

Lawrence J. Ken, Yap District Insular Constabulary, received a Special Award for his performance as Acting Clerk of Courts, Yap District during the period December 26, 1962 to November 15, 1963. During this time he took on responsibilities and carried them out conscientiously in the public interest, on short notice, without prior preparation for that particular position.
