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HOSPITAL ADMINISTRATOR TRAINING COURSE SCHEDULED

SATPAN, M.I. (August 20)...A field training program for Trust Territory hospital administrators is scheduled to be held in Saipan at the end of August. This two-week course, sponsored by the Institute for Technical Interchange, East-West Center, University of Hawaii, is part of the Public Health Department's new emphasis on in-service training. "Continuing education in hospital administration has been given one of our highest priorities," said High Commissioner M. W. Goding.

Major participants in the training course are: Jose T. Seman, Marianas; Halmar C. Lejjana, Marshalls; Constantino Victor, Ponape; Ngirakesau Tkel, Palau; Koichi Sana, Truk; and Roscoe Bonod, Yap. Clinical supervisors are also invited to attend.

The field training is a follow-up on the continuing education program for hospital administrators which was held at the East-West Center from September 1, 1964 to February 28, 1965.

The objectives of the field training are to:

- (1) Review what was learned in Hawaii and discuss the practicality of application and adaptation in Trust Territory hospitals;
- (2) Review and discuss changes made, if any, in Trust Territory hospitals, and evaluate and understand why they were successful or unsuccessful;

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- (3) Review and examine hospital management and administrative practices; understand the strengths of current hospital administration practices; recommend and/or correct the identifiable limitations in hospital administration; and
- (4) Plan and organize future in-service training programs for hospital staff and continuing education programs for promising employees outside of the Trust Territory.

Masao Tasaka, from the East-West Center, will be the instructor at the training course.

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
