SCHEDULE OF CONGRESSIONAL PARTY VISIT TO MARIANA
ISLANDS ANNOUNCED

SAIPAN, M. I. (NOV 12). . . Monday, November 15, will be the beginning of a busy schedule of activities for the Congressional party which is arriving in Saipan at 11:00 a. m. on the first stop in its visit to the six districts of the Trust Territory.

Monday afternoon the Congressmen, Ambassador Eugenie Anderson and Mrs. Ruth G. Van Cleve will attend a briefing by the High Commissioner and his staff. A reception will be given in honor of the group by High Commissioner and Mrs. M. W. Goding from 6:30 - 8:30 p. m. at the Toppa Tappi Club.

On Tuesday, the group will meet with World Health Organization representatives and the Economic Development Contract Team. Following that they will confer with the Legislative Counsel of the Congress of Micronesia, Kaleb Udui, prior to touring the proposed site for provisional buildings for the Congress of Micronesia.

On Tuesday afternoon from 2-3 p. m. the group will meet with the Saipan Chamber of Commerce at the Saipan Hotel after which there will be a short stop at Hopwood High School. From 4-5:30 p. m. Mariana

Islands District Administrator Peter T. Coleman will conduct a tour of Saipan. In the evening the Congressional party will dine with the High Commissioner and Mrs. Goding.

On Wednesday, the party is tentatively scheduled to visit public and parochial schools, Dr. Torres Memorial Hospital, Togawa's Poultry Farm, various businesses, Cruz's cattle pasture in Kagman, Radio Station KJQR, the power plant and the low cost housing and Micronesia Hotel Corporation sites.

In the afternoon, the group will meet first with Mayor Vicente Sablan and the District Commissioners, then jointly with the Municipal and District Legislatures at the Municipal Legislature Building. All meetings are open to the public.

At 7 p. m. Wednesday evening in the District Legislature Building a reception sponsored jointly by the Mariana Islands District Administration, Mariana Islands District Legislature, and Saipan Municipal Legislature will be held.

The Congressional party is scheduled to leave Saipan Thursday, November 18, for Tinian, Rota and Guam on its way to Yap and Palau.
