BROADCAST SPECIALIST ARRIVES

SAIPAN, MARIANA ISLANDS, TRUST TERRITORY OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS
February 15 . . . James R. LaForest has arrived in Saipan to begin his duties as Public Information Officer for Radio, according to John E. deYoung, Acting High Commissioner.

Mr. LaForest and his family (his wife, Shirley, and three children) transferred from the Trust Territory District Administration, Marshalls, where he served from 1964 as the first adult education specialist in the Territory. He began his work with the Trust Territory Government in 1961 in Truk, where he was a teacher supervisor. He participated in the setting up of the present district radio station there.

Before coming to Micronesia, Mr. LaForest taught school and worked on a newspaper for three years in Marlboro, New York, and worked for a radio station in Waterville, Maine, his hometown. He was in the U. S. Army from 1951 to 1953, and saw action in the Korean Campaign.
