FIRST MANAGEMENT INTERNS ARRIVE

Saipan, Mariana Islands, Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, Sept. 1 . . . Gideon Doone and Tatasy Wainit of Truk arrived today in Saipan to begin their management internships with the Personnel Department and the Economic Development Team, respectively, under the new training program for potential administrators.

Podis Pedras of Ponape is scheduled to begin his internship at the Personnel Department later this month.

The Management Intern Program has been initiated to select and systematically train young Micronesians who have the highest potential for administrative posts in the Government. The program contemplates that the first six months of each intern's employment will be devoted exclusively to planned systematic training in the administrative field in which he will be employed. After completion of the initial training, the management intern is put to work in a given junior management position under close supervision and instruction until he has developed full competence in one position; after which there will be opportunities to broaden his qualifications by selected rotational assignments. Candidates for this program

compete on the basis of a written examination consisting of the Differential Aptitude Test battery, college record, and personal qualifications (aptitudes, attitudes, and habits) considered essential for good administrators.

Gideon Doone was born in Losap Island, Truk, in 1938. He received his education at Xavier High School, Truk, the College of Guam, and the University of Hawaii. He has worked for the Trust Territory Government since 1955, most recently as Assistant Political Affairs Officer in Truk. He served as interpreter to Chief Petrus Mailo, Member of the House of Representatives, during the Second Regular Session of the Congress of Micronesia this year.

Tatasy Wainit was born on Udot Island, Truk in 1943. He received his A.A. degree from the College of Guam in 1964 and a B.A. in Economics from the University of Hawaii in 1966.

Podis Pedrus was born in Pingelap Island, Ponape, in 1942. He received his A.A. degree from the College of Guam in 1963 and his B.A. in Political Science from the University of Hawaii in 1966.
