HISTORIC BEACH IS SCENE OF INTERNATIONAL CREDIT UNION DAY CELEBRATION

Saipan, Mariana Islands, Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, October 17 . . Yesterday more than 500 members of the Saipan Credit Union and their families, making a crowd of approximately 1,000, celebrated International Credit Union Day on a beach which was the scene of the historic American invasion landings in World War II.

Significantly, the affair marked the first time that observance of International Credit Union Day was ever held in the Mariana Islands District; its main purpose was for members to reaffirm the philosophy of the credit union movement.

Speakers were High Commissioner William R. Norwood; Marianas District Administrator Peter T. Coleman; and Headquarters Cooperative Officer Samuel X. Mitchell. Presiding at the ceremonies was Salpan Credit Union President Olympio T. Borja, who is also a Senator in the Congress of Micronesia from Marianas District.

Secretary-Treasurer Jesus Mafnas reported that Saipan Credit Union now has 548 members and total assets of \$87,000. The credit union's assets more than doubled during 1965, and the officials expect a similar increase, to more than \$100,000, by the end of 1966.

TWO NEW CREDIT UNIONS CHARTERED

Saipan, Mariana Islands, Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, October 18 . . . Charters for two new credit unions were approved today by the High Commissioner: W. C. T. C. Credit Union, serving employees of Western Carolines Trading Company in Koror, Palau District; and KITCO Credit Union, serving employees of Kwajalein Importing and Trading Company in Majuro, Marshalls District.

The addition of the two new credit unions brings to 32 the number of established credit unions throughout the Trust Territory, according to Samuel X. Mitchell, Headquarters cooperative officer. In addition, seven other credit unions are in formative stages, Mr. Mitchell said.

At the end of 1965, the 26 credit unions then in operation had 3,645 members and total assets of \$290,533. Their members had saved \$263,570 or an average of \$72 per member. These credit unions had granted loans to members totaling \$896,190 from the period December 31, 1963, through December 31, 1965.

Mr. Mitchell expects that credit union total assets will reach \$500,000 by the end of this year and that total loans granted will pass \$1 million by a considerable margin.
